A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Statewide Blue Ribbon Task Force on County Realignment; providing legislative findings; creating the Statewide Blue Ribbon Task Force on County Realignment within the Department of Economic Opportunity; requiring the task force to evaluate and consider specified items; specifying the composition of the task force appointed in a specified timeframe; specifying requirements for meetings; requiring the department to provide administrative and technical support; requiring that task force members serve without compensation; specifying that task force members are not entitled to certain reimbursement; requiring the task force to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature by a certain date; specifying the minimum requirement for the report; providing for termination of the task force; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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## Section 1. The Legislature finds that:

- (1) While the population has continued to shift throughout this state, county boundaries have been mostly unchanged since 1925.
- (2) Counties are mandated by law to provide certain services for the benefit and protection of the public.
- (3) Local governments should perform at the highest level of efficiency and economy while providing the highest standards

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of governmental services to their citizens.

(4) This state should review whether changing county boundaries to address population shifts would help local governments provide more efficient local services and more effective public administration.

Section 2. (1) The Statewide Blue Ribbon Task Force on County Realignment, a task force as defined in s. 20.03(8),

Florida Statutes, is created within the Department of Economic Opportunity to study and evaluate the effectiveness, efficiency, and value of realigning, contracting, or expanding county boundaries in this state. The task force shall evaluate whether realigning, contracting, or consolidating county boundaries would help better serve constituent needs, and whether services offered by counties, including services offered by constitutional officers, could better serve the overall population of the state through realignment. The task force should consider incentives, efficiencies of services, economies of scale of key services, and all realignment scenarios.

- (2) The task force is composed of all of the following members, to be appointed by September 1, 2023:
- (a) The secretary of the Department of Economic
  Opportunity, or his or her designee, who shall serve as chair of the task force.
  - (b) Seven members appointed by the Governor, as follows:
- 1. One sitting county commissioner from a large county with a population of at least 900,000.
- 2. One sitting county commissioner from a medium-sized county with a population between 300,000 and 900,000.
  - 3. One sitting county commissioner from a small county with

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a population below 300,000.

- 4. One taxpayer from a charter county.
- 5. One taxpayer from a noncharter county.
- $\underline{\text{6. One taxpayer from a fiscally constrained county as}}$  defined in s. 218.67(1).
  - 7. One district school board member.
  - (c) Two members appointed by the President of the Senate.
- (d) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- (e) One representative of the Florida Association of Counties.
  - (f) One representative of the Florida League of Cities.
- (g) One representative of the Florida Association for Constitutional Officers.
- establish procedures for the conduct of its business and to elect a vice chair. The task force shall meet at the call of the chair. A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum, which is necessary for the purpose of voting on any action or recommendation of the task force. Administrative and technical support shall be provided by the Department of Economic Opportunity. Task force members shall serve without compensation and are not entitled to reimbursement for per diem or travel expenses from the state.
- (4) By October 1, 2024, the task force must submit a final report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report must, at a minimum, include recommendations for consideration by the Legislature.
