A bill to be entitled

An act relating to wireless provider automatic location identification services; creating s. 365.1755, F.S.; defining terms; requiring a wireless services provider to provide automatic location identification of an account holder's wireless telephone in certain circumstances; requiring automatic location identification services to be provided through an emergency number created by the wireless services provider; requiring calls to such number to be answered immediately; requiring requested automatic identification information to be provided in a specified format; authorizing certain persons to contact a wireless services provider and request a block for a specified timeframe on an account holder's ability to access automatic location identification services or information; requiring such requests to be confidential; authorizing a wireless services provider to charge a specified fee for automatic location identification services; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 365.1755, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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365.1755 Emergency telephone number; automatic location identification; wireless providers.—

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(1) As used in this section, the term:

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(a) "Account holder" means a person who is legally

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responsible and who enters into an agreement with a wireless telephone service provider for the purchase of a wireless telephone.

- (b) "Automatic location identification" means the automatic display at the Public Safety Answering Point of the caller's mobile telephone number, the address or location of the wireless telephone, and supplementary emergency services information.
- (c) "Emergency" means a situation, physical condition, or method of operation which presents imminent danger of death or serious physical or mental harm to a person.
- (d) "Family or household member" means spouses; former spouses; persons related by blood or marriage; persons who are presently residing together as if a family or who have resided together in the past as if a family; and persons who are parents of a child in common regardless of whether they have been married. Except for persons who have a child in common, the family or household members must be currently residing or have in the past resided together in the same single dwelling unit.
- (e) "Mobile telephone number" means the telephone number assigned to a wireless telephone at the time of initial activation.
- (f) "Wireless services provider" means a person who provides services using licensed or unlicensed spectrum, whether at a fixed location or mobile, using wireless facilities.
- (2) In the event of an actual or perceived emergency, a wireless services provider shall, immediately upon the request of an account holder, provide automatic location identification of the account holder's wireless telephone.
 - (3) Automatic location identification services shall be

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provided through a unique and well-advertised emergency number created by the wireless services provider. There shall be no wait times for persons who call the emergency number.

- (4) Any automatic location identification information provided by the wireless services provider shall be verbally provided through and graphically transmitted to the wireless telephone, regardless of whether the automatic location identification service has been activated or deactivated on the wireless telephone, except as provided in section (5).
- (5) A family or household member of an account holder who uses the account holder's wireless telephone may contact the wireless services provider and request a temporary block, not to exceed 30 days, on the account holder's ability to obtain automatic location identification services or information. The request shall be confidential and may not be provided to the account holder.
- (6) A wireless services provider may charge a fee for automatic location identification services of no more than \$5 per request.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
