A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Reduction In Black Female and Women's Maternal Mortality Grant Program; creating s. 381.998, F.S.; establishing the Reduction In Black Female and Women's Maternal Mortality Grant Program within the Department of Health; providing the purpose of the program; authorizing certain nonprofit organizations to apply for a grant through the program; authorizing the department to provide grants to such organizations for specified purposes, subject to legislative appropriation; authorizing the department to adopt rules to administer the program; providing an appropriation for specified purposes; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 381.998, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

(1) There is established the Reduction In Black Female and Women's Maternal Mortality Grant Program within the Department

of Health to provide grants to nonprofit organizations,

including the National Medical Association, the National or
Florida chapter of the Black Nurses Association, the National
Black Midwives Alliance, the Florida State University College of

Black Midwives Alliance, the Florida State University College of

Medicine, the University of Florida College of Medicine, the

University of South Florida College of Medicine, the University

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of Central Florida College of Medicine, and the Florida

Agricultural and Mechanical University School of Allied Health

Sciences, to work toward reducing Black female and women's

maternal mortality.

- (2) To receive a grant under the program, the nonprofit organizations identified in subsection (1) shall apply to the department in a manner prescribed by department.
- (3) Subject to legislative appropriation, the department shall award grants to the nonprofit organizations identified in subsection (1) to:
- (a) Study, develop, create, and publish protocols and educational materials relating to Black female and women's maternal mortality.
- (b) Conduct education and awareness workshops relating to reducing Black female and women's maternal mortality. Such workshops must use information and materials provided by the nonprofit organizations identified in subsection (1).
- (4) The Department of Health may adopt rules to administer this section.

Section 2. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the sum of \$5 million in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Health to fund the Reduction In Black Female and Women's Maternal Mortality Grant Program established by this act. Any unexpended balance of these funds as of June 30, 2025, must revert and is appropriated for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to the Department of Health for the same purpose.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
