An act relating to violations against vulnerable road users; creating s. 318.195, F.S.; providing a short title; requiring a person who commits a moving violation that causes serious bodily injury to or the death of a vulnerable road user to pay specified fines and attend a specified driver improvement course; requiring the court to revoke the person's driver license for a specified period; defining the term "vulnerable road user"; providing construction; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 318.195, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 318.195 Enhanced penalties for moving violations causing injury or death to vulnerable road users.—
- (1) This section may be cited as the "Vulnerable Road User Act."
- (2) A person who commits a moving violation that causes serious bodily injury, as defined in s. 316.1933(1)(b), to a vulnerable road user shall pay a fine of not less than \$1,500 and attend a department-approved driver improvement course relating to the rights of vulnerable road users relative to vehicles on the roadway as provided in s. 322.0261(2). The court shall also revoke the person's driver license for at least 30 days.
 - (3) A person who commits a moving violation that causes the

death of a vulnerable road user shall pay a fine of not less

than \$5,000 and attend a department-approved driver improvement

course relating to the rights of vulnerable road users relative to vehicles on the roadway as provided in s. 322.0261(2). The

court shall also revoke the person's driver license for at least 1 year.

- (4) As used in this section, the term "vulnerable road user" has the same meaning as in s. 316.027(1).
- (5) This section does not prohibit a person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
