Section 1. Section 947.28, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

 $\underline{947.28}$ Parole reinstatement for certain nonviolent felony offenders.—

- (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, parole is reinstated in this state for an offender who solely committed one or more nonviolent felony of the second degree offenses or nonviolent felony of the third degree offenses, including, but not limited to:
 - (a) Drug possession.
 - (b) Theft, grand theft, or larceny.
- (c) Possession of or trafficking of cannabis as defined in s. 893.02.
- (d) Burglary of an unoccupied dwelling, structure, or conveyance, and he or she was unarmed.
 - (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to:
- (a) A person who has been convicted of committing, or attempting, soliciting, or conspiring to commit, any of the following offenses:
 - 1. Section 794.011.
 - 2. Chapter 800.
