The 27 supervising veterinarian assumes responsibility for any person 28 vaccinating animals at his or her direction or under his or her 29 direct or indirect supervision. As used in this paragraph, the 30 term "indirect supervision" means that the supervising veterinarian is required to be available for consultation 31 32 through telecommunications but is not required to be physically 33 present during such consultation.

34 The owner of every dog, cat, and ferret shall have the (C) 35 animal revaccinated 12 months after the initial vaccination. Thereafter, the interval between vaccinations shall conform to 36 37 the vaccine manufacturer's directions. The cost of vaccination must be borne by the animal's owner. Evidence of circulating 38 39 rabies virus neutralizing antibodies may shall not be used as a 40 substitute for current vaccination in managing rabies exposure 41 or determining the need for booster vaccinations.

Upon vaccination against rabies, the licensed 42 (3) 43 veterinarian shall provide the animal's owner and the animal control authority with a rabies vaccination certificate. Each 44 45 animal control authority and veterinarian shall use the "Rabies Vaccination Certificate" of the National Association of State 46 47 Public Health Veterinarians (NASPHV) or an equivalent form 48 approved by the local government that contains all the 49 information required by the NASPHV Rabies Vaccination Certificate.
