House Resolution

A resolution designating April 2024 as "Minority Health Month" in Florida.

WHEREAS, National Minority Health Month is a month-long national initiative to advance the health of racial and ethnic minority communities and reduce health disparities, and

WHEREAS, National Minority Health Month began with the launching of National Health Improvement Week in 1915 by Booker T. Washington, which later became National Negro Health Week, and

WHEREAS, in 2002, the United States Congress issued a concurrent resolution, declaring that "a National Minority Health and Health Disparities Month should be established to promote educational efforts on the health problems currently facing minorities and other health disparity populations," and

WHEREAS, heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States, with one person dying from the disease every 33 seconds, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Human Services
Office of Minority Health estimates that 35.2 percent of African
Americans 18 years of age and older had high blood pressure in
2021, compared to 28.3 percent of non-Hispanic whites, and

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WHEREAS, in 2019, African Americans were 30 percent more likely to die from heart disease than non-Hispanic whites, and WHEREAS, according to the American Heart Association, from 2015 to 2018, 50.6 percent of Hispanic adult males and 40.8 percent of females 20 years of age or older in the United States had high blood pressure, and WHEREAS, blood pressure and cholesterol can be modified

WHEREAS, blood pressure and cholesterol can be modified through diet, exercise, and medication, and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Health and Human Services recognizes April as "National Minority Health Month," NOW, THEREFORE,

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Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

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That April 2024 is designated as "Minority Health Month" in Florida to increase awareness of high blood pressure and cholesterol screenings for all.

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
