SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/CS/SB 170 (2R) by the Committees on Budget Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Bennett—

Electronic Filing and Receipt of Court Documents; Requires each state attorney and public defender to electronically file court documents with the clerk of the court and receive court documents from the clerk of the court. Requires that the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association and the Florida Public Defender Association report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by a specified date on the progress made to use the Florida Courts E-Portal system or the clerks' offices portals to electronically file and receive court documents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

State Lotteries; Requires each retailer of lottery tickets to provide assistance to any individual who is blind or visually impaired and has requested assistance in filling out his or her lottery ticket. 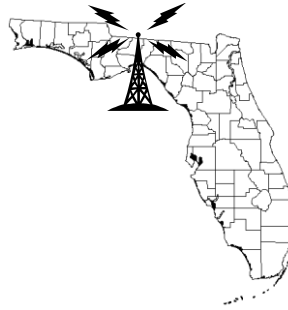
