## SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/CS/SB 170 (2R) by the Committees on Budget Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Bennett—

**Electronic Filing and Receipt of Court Documents;** Requires each state attorney and public defender to electronically file court documents with the clerk of the court and receive court documents from the clerk of the court. Requires that the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association and the Florida Public Defender Association report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by a specified date on the progress made to use the Florida Courts E-Portal system or the clerks' offices portals to electronically file and receive court documents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

#### SB 238 (2R) by Senator Altman and others-

**Child Safety Devices in Motor Vehicles;** Provides child-restraint requirements for children ages 4 through 7 years of age who are less than a specified height. Provides certain exceptions. Redefines the term "motor vehicle" to exclude certain vehicles from such requirements. Provides a grace period. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation; Criminal Justice; and Budget

#### SB 418 (2R) by Senator Flores—

**State Lotteries;** Requires each retailer of lottery tickets to provide assistance to any individual who is blind or visually impaired and has requested assistance in filling out his or her lottery ticket. Provides that a retailer or an employee of the retailer is not liable under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Regulated Industries; Commerce and Tourism; and Rules

#### SB 462 (2R) by Senator Latvala and others-

**Beverage Law;** Exempts performance arts centers from obtaining approval from the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation of volunteer officers or directors of the performing arts center or of changes in such positions. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

#### SB 1100 (2R) by Senator Detert-

**Residence of the Clerk of the Circuit Court;** Repeals provisions relating to the clerk of the circuit court's place of residence. Effective Date: 07/01/2011
