SB 16 (2R) by Senator Ring-

Relief/Harris & Williams/N. Broward Hospital Dist.;

Compensates Laron S. Harris, Jr., by and through his parents, Melinda Williams and Laron S. Harris, Sr., and Melinda Williams and Laron S. Harris, Sr., individually, for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the North Broward Hospital District, d/b/a Coral Springs Medical Center. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 22 (2R) by Senator Hill-

Relief/Estate of Cesar Solomon/JTA; Compensates the Estate of Cesar Solomon for Mr. Solomon's death, which was the result of negligence by a bus driver of the Jacksonville Transportation Authority. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 34 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Dean—

Relief/Angela Isham/City of Ft. Lauderdale; Compensates Angela Isham, individually, and as co-personal representative of the Estate of David Isham, deceased, for the death of Mr. Isham, which was due to the negligence of employees of the City of Ft. Lauderdale. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 46 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Haridopolos—

Relief/William Dillon/State of Florida; Compensates William Dillon, who was wrongfully incarcerated for 27 years and exonerated by a court after DNA testing. Directs the Chief Financial Officer to draw a warrant for the purchase of an annuity. Provides for a waiver of certain tuition and fees. Provides conditions for payment. Provides that the act does not waive certain defenses or increase the state's liability, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 70 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Negron—

Relief/Carl Abbott/Palm Beach County School Board;

Compensates Carl Abbott for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the Palm Beach County School District. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 106 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Ring—

Public Records; Creates an exemption from public records requirements for information that identifies a donor or prospective donor of a donation made for the benefit of a publicly owned performing arts center if the donor desires to remain anonymous. Creates such exemption for information identifying a donor or prospective donor to the direct-support organization of the Legislative Research Center and Museum at the Historic Capitol. Provides for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions under the Open Government Sunset Review Act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 238 (2R) by Senator Altman and others-

Child Safety Devices in Motor Vehicles; Provides child-restraint requirements for children ages 4 through 7 years of age who are less than a specified height. Provides certain exceptions. Redefines the term "motor vehicle" to exclude certain vehicles from such requirements. Provides a grace period. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation; Criminal Justice; and Budget

CS/CS/SB 274 (2R) by the Committees on Budget, Transportation and Senator Lynn—

Road and Bridge Designations; Designates Senator Javier D. Souto Way in Miami-Dade County. Designates Nona and Papa Road in St. Johns County. Designates Walter Francis Spence Parkway in Okaloosa County. Designates Corporal Michael J. Roberts Parkway in Hillsborough County. Designates the Florida Highway Patrol Trooper Sgt. Nicholas G. Sottile Memorial in Highlands County, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 306 (2R) by Senator Rich-

Relief/Brown/North Broward Hospital District; Compensates Denise Gordon Brown and David Brown, parents of Darian Brown, for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of Broward General Medical Center. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 324 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Flores—

Relief/James D. Feurtado, III/Miami-Dade County;

Compensates James D. Feurtado, III, for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of an employee of Miami-Dade County. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 408 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Budget Subcommittee on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Richter and others—

Property and Casualty Insurance; Revises the definition of "losses," relating to the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund, to exclude certain losses. Authorizes an insurer to renegotiate the terms a surplus note issued before a certain date. Revises the amount of surplus funds required for domestic insurers applying for a certificate of authority after a certain date. Authorizes the OIR to reduce the surplus requirement under specified circumstances. Renames the "Citizens Property Insurance Corporation" as the "Taxpayer-Funded Property Insurance Corporation," etc. Effective Date: June 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget Subcommittee on General Government Appropriations; the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably, with two amendments; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 418 (2R) by Senator Flores-

State Lotteries; Requires each retailer of lottery tickets to provide assistance to any individual who is blind or visually impaired and has requested assistance in filling out his or her lottery ticket. Provides that a retailer or an employee of the retailer is not liable under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Regulated Industries; Commerce and Tourism; and Rules

SB 420 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation-

OGSR/Florida Center for Brain Tumor Research; Provides that personal identifying information pertaining to a donor to the central repository for brain tumor biopsies or the brain tumor registry of the Florida Center for Brain Tumor Research is confidential and exempt from public records requirements. Provides an exception under certain conditions for information disclosed to a person engaged in bona fide research. Provides for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Regulation; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 464 (2R) by Senator Latvala-

Assault or Battery of a Law Enforcement Officer; Requires the Department of Law Enforcement to issue a blue alert if a law enforcement officer has been killed, suffered serious bodily injury, or been assaulted and the suspect has fled the scene, or if a law enforcement officer is missing while in the line of duty. Requires that the blue alert be disseminated on the emergency alert system through television, radio, and highway signs. Provides that emergency traffic information may take precedence over blue alert information. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice; Transportation; and Budget

CS/CS/SB 512 (2R) by the Committees on Budget, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Negron—

Vessels; Revises penalty provisions for the violation of navigation rules. Provides that a violation resulting in serious bodily injury or death is a second-degree misdemeanor. Provides that a violation that does not constitute reckless operation of a vessel is a noncriminal violation. Provides an additional exemption from the requirement that certain persons possess a boating safety identification card while operating a motor vessel of a specified horsepower. Provides for increased penalties for certain noncriminal violations of navigation rules, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 514 (2R) by Senator Garcia-

Vehicle Crashes Involving Death; Cites this act as the "Ashley Nicole Valdes Act." Requires a defendant who was arrested for leaving the scene of a crash involving death be held in custody until brought before a judge for admittance to bail in certain circumstances. Reenacts provision relating to the Criminal Punishment Code, to incorporate the amendments made to provision in a reference thereto. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice; Judiciary; and Budget

CS/CS/SB 520 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Military Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Senator Bennett and others—

State Memorials; Establishes the Florida Veterans' Hall of Fame on the Plaza Level of the Capitol Building. Provides for the Department of Veterans' Affairs to administer the Florida Veterans' Hall of Fame. Authorizes the department to establish a nomination and selection process and an induction ceremony, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 568 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary-

OGSR/Court Records/Court Monitors/Guardianship; Amends provisions relating to public record exemptions for court records relating to court monitors in guardianship proceedings. Consolidates provisions. Provides that orders appointing nonemergency court monitors are exempt rather than confidential and exempt. Provides that only court orders finding no probable cause are confidential and exempt. Saves the exemptions from repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act. Removes the scheduled repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 570 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary-

OGSR/Interference With Custody; Amends a provision relating to a public records exemption for information submitted to a sheriff or state attorney for the purpose of obtaining immunity from prosecution for the offense of interference with custody. Saves the exemption from repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act. Deletes a provision providing for the repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/SB 572 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Judiciary—

OGSR/Statewide Public Guardianship Office; Amends a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for information that identifies certain donors or prospective donors to the direct-support organization for the Statewide Public Guardianship Office. Removes superfluous and duplicative language. Repeals a provision which provides for repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/CS/SB 594 (2R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Judiciary and Senator Hays—

Sovereign Immunity; Requires that a claim in a wrongful death case be presented to the Department of Financial Services (DFS) within 2 years after the claim accrues. Provides that failure of the DFS or the appropriate agency to make final disposition of a claim for wrongful death within 90 days after it is filed is deemed to be a final denial of the claim. Tolls the statute of limitations for the period of time taken by the DFS or other agency to deny a medical malpractice or wrongful death claim. Specifies applicability to workers' compensation claims, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 600 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Criminal Justice—

OGSR/Records/DJJ Employees & Family Members; Amends a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for identification and location information of certain current and former employees of the Department of Juvenile Justice and their family members. Revises the job classifications specified in the exemption to reflect those classifications used by the department. Removes the scheduled repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 602 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice-

OGSR/Biometric Identification Information; Amends a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for biometric identification information held by an agency. Saves the exemption from repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act. Removes the scheduled repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 604 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice-

OGSR/Concealed Weapons or Firearms; Amends provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of an individual who has applied for or received a license to carry a concealed weapon or firearm. Saves the exemption from repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act. Removes the scheduled repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SB 626 (2R) by Senator Thrasher and others-

Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc.; Clarifies provisions relating to references to the corporation known as Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc. Clarifies provisions regarding the purpose of the corporation. Authorizes the corporation to create corporate subsidiaries and affiliates. Provides that Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc., Shands Jacksonville Medical Center, Inc., Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc., and any not-for-profit subsidiary of such entities are instrumentalities of the state for purposes of sovereign immunity. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Regulation; Higher Education; and Budget

CS/SB 650 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Jones and others—

Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies; Provides for local code and ordinance violations to be cited to the responsible party. Prohibits liens, penalties, fines, or other administrative or civil proceedings against one party or that party's property for a duty or responsibility of the other party. Revises procedures for mobile home owners being provided eviction notice due to a change in use of the land comprising the mobile home park or the portion thereof from which mobile homes are to be evicted, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and the Committees on Community Affairs; and Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 652 (2R) by Senator Simmons and others-

Liability of Spaceflight Entities; Saves a provision from future repeal which provides spaceflight entities with immunity from liability for the loss, damage, or death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks of spaceflight activities. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Military Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; Judiciary; and Rules

CS/SB 670 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Joyner—

Powers of Attorney; Provides for a durable power of attorney. Specifies the qualifications for an agent. Provides requirements for the execution of a power of attorney. Provides for the validity of powers of attorney created by a certain date or in another jurisdiction. Provides for the validity of a military power of attorney. Provides for the validity of a photocopy or electronic copy of a power of attorney. Provides for the meaning and effectiveness of a power of attorney, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committees on Banking and Insurance; and Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 704 (2R) by Senator Sachs and others-

Special Observances/Purple Heart Day; Designates August 7 of each year as "Purple Heart Day." Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Military Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules

CS/CS/SB 818 (2R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Health Regulation, Senator Fasano and others—

Controlled Substances; Authorizes certain health care practitioners to complete a continuing education course relating to the prescription drug monitoring program. Creates a felony of the third degree for any person to register or attempt to register a pain-management clinic through misrepresentation or fraud. Revises the list of entities that are not required to register as a pain-management clinic. Requires that the prescription drug monitoring program comply with the minimum requirements of the National All Schedules Prescription Electronic Reporting Act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

SM 852 (2R) by Senator Hays and others-

Supporting the Marketing of Florida Seafood; Urges the Congress of the United States to support the marketing of Florida seafood.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Conservation; Commerce and Tourism; and Agriculture

CS/SB 886 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Oelrich—

Motor Vehicles; Revises penalties for unlawful operation of a soundmaking device in a motor vehicle. Provides that a second or subsequent violation is a moving violation and includes the assessment of points against the driver's license. Provides increased penalties for repeat violations within a certain time period. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; and the Committees on Budget; and Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 926 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Storms—

Liability/Employers of Developmentally Disabled; Provides that an employer, under certain circumstances, is not liable for the acts or omissions of an employee who is a person with a developmental disability. Provides that a supported employment service provider that provides or has provided supported employment services to a person with a developmental disability is not liable for the actions or conduct of the person occurring within the scope of the person's employment. Defines the terms "developmental disability" and "supported employment service provider." Provides for application of the act. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 930 (2R) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Judiciary, Senator Lynn and others—

Protection of Volunteers; Clarifies that in order to fall under the protection of the Florida Volunteer Protection Act, a person performing a service for a nonprofit organization may not receive compensation from the nonprofit organization for that service, regardless of whether the person is receiving compensation from another source. Provides an exception. Provides for application of the act. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably

SM 954 (2R) by Senator Flores and others-

Parental Rights Amendment; Urges the Congress of the United States to propose to the states for ratification an amendment to the United States Constitution relating to parental rights.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary; Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/SB 994 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Latvala—

Public Records/Public Airports; Provides definitions. Provides an exemption from public records requirements for proprietary confidential business information and trade secrets held by a public airport and for any proposal or counterproposal exchanged between a public airport and a nongovernmental entity relating to the sale, use, development, or lease of airport facilities. Provides for expiration of the exemptions. Provides for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions under the Open Government Sunset Review Act. Provides a finding of public necessity. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 998 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Simmons and others—

Property Rights; Redefines the terms "inordinate burden" and "inordinately burdened" as they relate to the Bert J. Harris, Jr., Private Property Rights Protection Act to specify that a moratorium on development in effect for longer than a specified period constitutes an inordinate burden. Revises the time within which a property owner who seeks compensation must present the claim in writing to the head of the governmental entity. Revises the time within which a governmental entity must make a written settlement offer to a claimant, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1086 (2R) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Criminal Justice, Senator Hill and others—

Restraint of Incarcerated Pregnant Women; Prohibits use of restraints on a prisoner known to be pregnant during labor, delivery, and postpartum recovery unless a corrections official makes an individualized determination that the prisoner presents an extraordinary circumstance requiring restraints. Provides that a doctor, nurse, or other health care professional treating the prisoner may request that restraints not be used, in which case the corrections officer or other official accompanying the prisoner shall remove all restraints, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011
