SB 2000, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Appropriations; Provides moneys for the annual period beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, to pay salaries, and other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, and other improvements, and for other specified purposes of the various agencies of state government. Effective Date: 07/01/2011 OR except as otherwise provided

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2011

SB 2002, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Implementing 2011-2012 General Appropriations Act; Incorporates by reference certain calculations of the Florida Education Finance Program for the 2011-2012 fiscal year. Authorizes the transfer of funds between appropriation categories to fund fixed capital outlay projects for public schools upon certain approval. Provides allocation requirements for specified funds appropriated for forensic mental health services. Provides requirements relating to implementing phase 3 of the Department of Health's Florida Onsite Sewage Nitrogen Reduction Strategies Study, etc. Effective Date: 06/29/2011 OR except as otherwise provided

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2011

SB 2120, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

K-12 Education Funding; Authorizes the Department of Revenue to provide certain information regarding the gross receipts tax to the State Board of Education, the Division of Bond Finance, and the Office of Economic and Demographic Research. Requires that, for purposes of servicing public education capital outlay bonds, the State Board of Education disregard the effects on the gross receipts tax revenues collected during a tax period of a refund resulting from a specified settlement agreement, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law, except as otherwise provided

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2011

SB 2150 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Postsecondary Education Funding; Authorizes the Department of Revenue to provide certain information regarding the gross receipts tax to the State Board of Education, the Division of Bond Finance, and the Office of Economic and Demographic Research. Requires that, for purposes of servicing public education capital outlay bonds, the State Board of Education disregard the effects on the gross receipts tax revenues collected during a tax period of a refund resulting from a specified settlement agreement, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law, except as otherwise provided

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2114 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Juvenile Justice; Provides legislative intent. Defines the term "regional coordinating agency." Provides requirements for a regional coordinating agency. Requires the Department of Juvenile Justice to contract with regional coordinating agencies for specified services relating to juvenile justice. Gives hiring preference to current department employees who meet provider qualifications if they apply for employment with the regional coordinating agencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2116 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

State Judicial System; Creates the Judicial Caseload Incentive Plan. Prescribes the purpose of the plan. Provides for performance goals for each judicial circuit. Authorizes financial awards to certain judges based on the performance of the circuit in meeting the goals. Authorizes each office of criminal conflict and civil regional counsel to create a direct-support organization. Prescribes requirements related to the creation and operation of the direct-support organization, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2118 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Criminal Justice; Repeals provisions relating to the Cybercrime Office within the Department of Legal Affairs. Limits the number of hours in the basic recruit training program required for correctional officers, unless the officer is otherwise exempt. Creates the Cybercrime Office within the Department of Law Enforcement to investigate certain violations of state law pertaining to the sexual exploitation of children. Repeals provisions relating to the basic training program for youthful offenders within the Department of Corrections, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2112 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Juvenile Detention Facilities; Exempts a county that covers the costs of detention care for pre-adjudicated juveniles within its jurisdiction or other jurisdictions from certain requirements for sharing the costs for juvenile detention. Provides that a county or county sheriff that meets certain prerequisites with respect to the operation of its juvenile detention facility is exempt from certain requirements of law governing the administration of such facilities. Authorizes a county or county sheriff to operate regional detention facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2144, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Medicaid; Provides for funding the Medicaid reimbursement for certain persons age 65 or older while the optional program is being phased out. Renames the "medically needy" program as the "Medicaid nonpoverty medical subsidy." Limits certain categories of persons eligible for the subsidy to only physician services after a certain date. Deletes the hospitalist program. Revises the factors for calculating the maximum allowable fee for pharmaceutical ingredient costs. Directs the AHCA to establish reimbursement rates for the next fiscal year, etc. Effective Date: 06/30/2011

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2011

SB 2146 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Department of Children and Family Services; Revises provisions relating to the department's duties with respect to domestic violence. Provides that annual certification of domestic violence centers depends on a favorable review by the Florida Coalition Against Domestic Violence. Authorizes the coalition to enter and inspect centers for monitoring purposes. Requires the department to contract with the coalition for the management of domestic violence service delivery and the monitoring of centers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2148 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Agency for Persons With Disabilities; Prohibits the agency from expending funds above the amount appropriated in the General Appropriations Act. Requires that the agency monitor monthly program expenditures and provide quarterly reports to the Governor and Legislature. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2122 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Consumer Protection; Removes the Division of Dairy Industry within the Department Agriculture and Consumer Services. Requires the Department of Legal Affairs, rather than the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, to distribute free of charge a motor vehicle consumer's rights pamphlet. Provides for the state attorneys and the Department of Legal Affairs, rather than the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, to enforce the law prohibiting price gouging, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2124 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Department of Revenue; Extends from once every 2 years to once every 3 years the requirement that the department conduct an in-depth review of the assessment roll of each county. Provides for a study of certain classifications constituting 5 percent or more of the total assessed value of real property on the previous assessment roll. Imposes a tax on the charges for the use of coin-operated amusement machines operated on the licensed premises of a pari-mutuel facility located in certain cities or counties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2126 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Department of Management Services; Provides for the reimbursement to the department of actual costs for coordinating the Florida State Employee's Charitable Campaign. Requires the cost factors for a fixed capital outlay project to include an estimate for the finishing of interiors. Requires that cost savings realized when actual costs are less than the projected costs for a fixed capital outlay project be used to reduce the overall construction costs. Prohibits the purchase of art using public funds except as authorized by law, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2128 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Public Employees Relations Commission; Requires that the commission be composed of a chair and two part-time members rather than two full-time members. Provides for the chair of the commission to remain as a full-time appointment. Prohibits the part-time members from engaging in any business, vocation, or employment that conflicts with their duties while in such office. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2130 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Pollution Control; Revises requirements for the deposit of funds used in providing financial assistance for water pollution control. Requires that such funds be deposited into the department's Federal Grants Trust Fund rather than the department's Grants and Donations Trust Fund. Specifies additional uses of moneys deposited into the Federal Grants Trust Fund. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2132 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Department of Financial Services; Repeals provisions relating to the Chief Financial Officer's authorization to operate a personal check-cashing service or a remote financial service unit at the capitol and to employ additional persons to assist in performing such services. Abolishes appropriations from the General Revenue Fund to pay the salaries of the additional employees. Revises the duties of the Division of Consumer Services. Revises the criteria for premiums charged to agencies and departments for purposes of the State Risk Management Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2134 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; Repeals provisions relating to the procurement of goods and services by the corporation. Provides standards for procurements by Citizens Property Insurance Corporation. Requires the corporation's legal department and purchasing department to jointly prepare a contract for the procurement of goods or services. Includes a board member or an employee of the corporation within the definition of the term "public servant" as it relates to the crime of bribery and the misuse of public office, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2012

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2136 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Federal Grants Trust Fund/DBPR; Creates the Federal Grants Trust Fund within the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. Provides for the purpose of the trust fund and sources of funds. Provides for future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, if enacted by three-fifths vote of membership of Legislature

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2142, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Water Management Districts; Provides requirements with respect to revenues received by each water management district and the unexpended balances of a district's local account. Requires that each district's expenditure of funds be as provided in the General Appropriations Act. Provides for a contingency if a court finds such restriction to be invalid. Provides that the Legislature may annually set the amount of revenue a district may raise through its ad valorem tax authority, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read the second time and amended on April 6, 2011

SB 2152 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Transportation; Provides additional funds for 5 years to fund certain projects through the Florida Deepwater Seaport Program. Specifies that certain statutory provisions related to special matters to be considered in rule adoption do not apply to the adjustment of toll rates. Transfers control of the Tampa-Hillsborough County Expressway Authority, the Orlando-Orange County Expressway Authority, and the Mid-Bay Bridge Authority systems to the Florida Turnpike Enterprise, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2154 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Florida Housing Finance Corporation; Deletes provisions on the distributions of documentary stamp tax revenues to the State Housing Trust Fund and the Local Government Housing Trust Fund. Replaces references to the Department of Community Affairs with Jobs Florida. Provides for the deposit of certain moneys into the State Housing Trust Fund within the State Treasury. Replaces references to the Secretary of the Department of Community Affairs with the Commissioner of Jobs Florida. Provides for certain moneys to be deposited into the State Housing Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on April 6, 2011

SB 2156, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Governmental Reorganization; Transfers the functions and trust funds of the Agency for Workforce Innovation to other agencies. Revises the divisions within the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. Creates the Office of Motor Carrier Compliance of the Division of the Florida Highway Patrol within the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

SB 2162 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Welfare Transition Trust Fund/DOE; Creates the Welfare Transition Trust Fund within the Department of Education. Provides for sources of funds and purposes. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, if enacted by three-fifths vote of membership of Legislature

SB 2094 (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

State Employees; Provides for the resolution of collective bargaining issues at impasse between the state and certified bargaining units of state employees. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Retirement; Requires employee and employer contributions to the retirement system by a certain date. Provides that special risk employee contributions be used, if applicable, when purchasing credit for past service. Revises the cost-of-living adjustment depending on the date of retirement, etc. Effective Date: 06/30/2011

CS/CS/SB 1292 (3R) by the Committees on Budget, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Alexander—

Transfers the duties of the Florida Energy and Climate Commission with respect to planning and developing the state's energy policy and its duties under the Florida Energy and Climate Protection Act to the Department of Environmental Protection, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

SB 2108, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Budget—

Welfare of Children; Repeals provisions relating to the Office of Adoption and Child Protection within the Executive Office of the Governor. Removes obsolete provisions relating to the Office of Adoption and Child Protection within the Executive Office of the Governor. Requires all state, county, and local agencies to cooperate, assist, and provide information to the Department of Children and Family Services rather than the Office of Adoption and Child Protection, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Harris, Sr., individually, for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the North Broward Hospital District, d/b/a Coral Springs Medical Center. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 22 (2R) by Senator Hill—

Relief/Estate of Cesar Solomon/JTA; Compensates the Estate of Cesar Solomon for Mr. Solomon's death, which was the result of negligence by a bus driver of the Jacksonville Transportation Authority. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 34 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Dean—

Relief/Angela Isham/City of Ft. Lauderdale; Compensates Angela Isham, individually, and as co-personal representative of the Estate of David Isham, deceased, for the death of Mr. Isham, which was due to the negligence of employees of the City of Ft. Lauderdale. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 46 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Haridopolos—

Relief/William Dillon/State of Florida; Compensates William Dillon, who was wrongfully incarcerated for 27 years and exonerated by a court after DNA testing. Directs the Chief Financial Officer to draw a warrant for the purchase of an annuity. Provides for a waiver of certain tuition and fees. Provides conditions for payment. Provides that the act does not waive certain defenses or increase the state's liability, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 70 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Negron—

Relief/Carl Abbott/Palm Beach County School Board; Compensates Carl Abbott for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the Palm Beach County School District. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 238 (2R) by Senator Altman and others—

Child Safety Devices in Motor Vehicles; Provides child-restraint requirements for children ages 4 through 7 years of age who are less than a specified height. Provides certain exceptions. Redefines the term "motor vehicle" to exclude certain vehicles from such requirements. Provides a grace period. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation; Criminal Justice; and Budget

SB 306 (2R) by Senator Rich—

Relief/Brown/North Broward Hospital District; Compensates Denise Gordon Brown and David Brown, parents of Darian Brown, for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of Broward General Medical Center. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 324 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Flores—

Relief/James D. Feurtado, III/Miami-Dade County; Compensates James D. Feurtado, III, for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of an employee of Miami-Dade County. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 418 (2R) by Senator Flores—

State Lotteries; Requires each retailer of lottery tickets to provide assistance to any individual who is blind or visually impaired and has requested assistance in filling out his or her lottery ticket. Provides that a retailer or an employee of the retailer is not liable under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Regulated Industries; Commerce and Tourism; and Rules

SB 464 (2R) by Senator Latvala—

Assault or Battery of a Law Enforcement Officer; Requires the Department of Law Enforcement to issue a blue alert if a law enforcement officer has been killed, suffered serious bodily injury, or been assaulted and the suspect has fled the scene, or if a law enforcement officer is missing while in the line of duty. Requires that the blue alert be disseminated on the emergency alert system through television, radio, and highway signs. Provides that emergency traffic information may take precedence over blue alert information. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice; Transportation; and Budget

SB 514 (2R) by Senator Garcia—

Vehicle Crashes Involving Death; Cites this act as the "Ashley Nicole Valdes Act." Requires a defendant who was arrested for leaving the scene of a crash involving death be held in custody until brought before a judge for admittance to bail in certain circumstances. Reenacts provision relating to the Criminal Punishment Code, to incorporate the amendments made to provision in a reference thereto. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice; Judiciary; and Budget

SB 626 (2R) by Senator Thrasher and others—

Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc.; Clarifies provisions relating to references to the corporation known as Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc. Clarifies provisions regarding the purpose of the corporation. Authorizes the corporation to create corporate subsidiaries and affiliates. Provides that Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc., Shands Jacksonville Medical Center, Inc., Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc., and any not-for-profit subsidiary of such entities are instrumentalities of the state for purposes of sovereign immunity. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Regulation; Higher Education; and Budget

CS/SB 650 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Jones and others—

Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies; Provides for local code and ordinance violations to be cited to the responsible party. Prohibits liens, penalties, fines, or other administrative or civil proceedings against one party or that party's property for a duty or responsibility of the other party. Revises procedures for mobile home owners being provided eviction notice due to a change in use of the land comprising the mobile home park or the portion thereof from which mobile homes are to be evicted, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and the Committees on Community Affairs; and Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 670 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Joyner—

Powers of Attorney; Provides for a durable power of attorney. Specifies the qualifications for an agent. Provides requirements for the execution of a power of attorney. Provides for the validity of powers of attorney created by a certain date or in another jurisdiction. Provides for the validity of a military power of attorney. Provides for the validity of a photocopy or electronic copy of a power of attorney. Provides for the meaning and effectiveness of a power of attorney, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committees on Banking and Insurance; and Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SM 954 (2R) by Senator Flores and others—

Parental Rights Amendment; Urges the Congress of the United States to propose to the states for ratification an amendment to the United States Constitution relating to parental rights.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary; Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

SM 1344 (2R) by Senator Flores—

U.S. Treasury/Deposits by Nonresident Aliens; Urges the Congress of the United States to direct the Department of the Treasury to withdraw a proposed rule on deposits made by nonresident aliens and to examine the proposed rule for negative effects.

Protection of Volunteers; Clarifies that in order to fall under the protection of the Florida Volunteer Protection Act, a person performing a service for a nonprofit organization may not receive compensation from the nonprofit organization for that service, regardless of whether the person is receiving compensation from another source. Provides an exception. Provides for application of the act. Effective Date: 07/01/2011
