Senate Bills Referenced Since Last Calendar

SB 142 by Richter

Negligence; Defines the terms "negligence action" and "products liability action." Requires the trier of fact to consider the fault of all persons who contributed to an accident when apportioning damages in a products liability action alleging an additional or enhanced injury. 
