Motor Vehicle Insurance & Driver Education for Children in Foster Care; Removes disability of nonage of minors for purposes of obtaining motor vehicle insurance; provides for preferential enrollment in driver education courses for children in foster care. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Economic Development; Revises provisions relating to transportation concurrency, impact fees, loan programs, urban redevelopment, Space Florida, Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund contributions, & rural areas of critical economic concern. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1634(SUB) (Detert) and read the second time on April 30, 2014. Amended on May 1, 2014.

CS/CS/HB 805 (3R) by the Committees on Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance and Banking Subcommittee and Representative Moraitis—

Title Insurer Reserves; Revises criteria with respect to liabilities charged against assets in determinations of financial condition; specifies reserves certain title insurers must set aside after certain date; specifies manner in which reserves must be released; specifies which state law governs amount of reserve for title insurer who transfers domicile to this state; provides that domestic title insurer is not required to record separate bulk reserves; requires domestic title insurers to obtain approval from OIR before using or recording bulk reserve; revises & providing definitions. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Department of Transportation; Removes provisions for Florida Statewide Passenger Rail Commission & transportation corporations; revises duties of Florida Transportation Commission; revises provisions relating to load limits, road projects, contractors & competitive bidding, lease-purchase agreements, conveyance of property, toll collection & video billing systems, fees from Alligator Alley tolls, M.P.O's & Metropolitan Planning Organization Advisory Council, environmental impact mitigation, Northwest Florida Transportation Corridor Authority & Tampa Bay Area Regional Transportation Authority, Pinellas Bayway, & outdoor signs; provides for sale of accounts receivable from certain leases. Effective Date: 07/01/2014
