**State Park Fees;** Providing certain discounts on state park fees to specified foster and adoptive families; requiring the Division of Recreation and Parks within the Department of Environmental Protection to establish certain documentation standards and create a procedure for obtaining the discounts; requiring the division to continue a partnership with the Department of Children and Families to promote fostering and adoption of special needs children with certain events, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 185(HC)** in the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Conservation; Appropriations Subcommittee on the Environment and Natural Resources; and Appropriations*

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#### **HB 1233 (3R) by Representatives White, Ahern and others—**

**Cottage Food Operations;** Increases annual gross sales limitation for exempting cottage food operations from certain food & building permitting requirements; authorizes certain advertisement & sale of, & payment for, cottage food products; prohibits certain delivery of cottage food products. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1136(SUB)** (Lee) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

#### **SB 1390 (3R) by Senator Latvala and others—**

**Transportation Facility Designations;** Providing an honorary designation of a certain transportation facility in a specified county, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Read the second time on April 26, 2017*

*Identical to **HB 1169(HC)** in the Committees on Transportation; Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and Appropriations*

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#### **HB 7113 (3R) by the Committee on Government Accountability Committee and Representative Willhite—**

**OGSR/Donor or Prospective Donor/Publicly Owned Performing Arts Center;** Removes scheduled repeal of public records exemption for information that identifies donor or prospective donor of donation made for benefit of publicly owned performing arts center if donor desires to remain anonymous. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

*Substituted for **SB 7002(SUB)** (Lee) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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#### **CS/SB 102 (3R) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Steube and others—**

**Payment of Health Care Claims;** Prohibiting a health insurer or a health maintenance organization from retroactively denying a claim under specified circumstances; exempting certain Medicaid managed care plans, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Read the second time on April 26, 2017*

**CS/CS/SB 368, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Montford—**

**Transportation Facility Designations;** Providing honorary designations of various transportation facilities in specified counties; directing the department to erect signage in specified counties to commemorate certain conflicts involving the United States Armed Forces, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/CS/SB 1338 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Book—**

**Vessels;** Authorizing certain grandfathered private residential multifamily docks to exceed the number of moored boats for the number of residential units; authorizing owners of certain private submerged land to request that the commission establish boating-restricted areas to protect certain seagrass; authorizing a local government to enact and enforce certain regulations that prohibit or restrict mooring or anchoring of certain vessels, that require sewage disposal by certain vessels and floating structures, and that authorize the removal of certain vessels, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Read the second time on April 26, 2017*

*Similar to CS/CS/HB 7043(HC) in the Committee on Appropriations*

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**CS/CS/SB 370, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Senator Stargel and others—**

**Florida Wing of the Civil Air Patrol;** Requiring certain employers to provide Civil Air Patrol leave; prohibiting specified public and private employers from discharging, reprimanding, or penalizing a Civil Air Patrol member because of his or her absence by reason of taking Civil Air Patrol leave, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/CS/SB 800 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Broxson and others—**

**Medication Synchronization;** Requiring health insurers and health maintenance organizations, respectively, which issue or deliver certain policies or contracts to offer medication synchronization to allow insureds and subscribers to align refill dates for certain drugs at least once in a plan year; requiring such insurers and health maintenance organizations to implement a process for aligning such dates, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2018

*Read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/CS/SB 890 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senator Bean and others—**

**Florida Endowment for Vocational Rehabilitation;** Requiring the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to maintain separate accounts for certain funds received from state sources and public or private sources; requiring that funds allocated for research, advertising, or consulting be subject to a competitive solicitation process; extending the date for future review and repeal of provisions governing the Florida Endowment for Vocational Rehabilitation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

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**CS/CS/SB 896 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education and Senator Simmons—**

**Florida Prepaid College Board;** Revising the financial disclosures required to be filed by certain Florida Prepaid College Board members; extending the repeal date of the direct-support organization for the Florida Prepaid College Board, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

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**CS/HB 577, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Health Innovation Subcommittee and Representative Pigman—**

**Discount Plan Organizations;** Provides record keeping & disclosure requirements for discount plan organizations; revises conditions for member to receive reimbursement of certain charges after cancelling membership in such organization; authorizes discount plan organization to delegate functions to its marketers; revises authority for FSC to adopt rules. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for CS/CS/SB 430(SUB) (Bean) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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**SB 438 (3R) by Senator Baxley—**

**Out-of-school Suspension;** Authorizing a parent to give public testimony regarding a district school board's out-of-school suspension policy at a specified meeting; requiring a district school board to review its rules authorizing out-of-school suspension during a specified timeframe at a district school board meeting; requiring the board to take public testimony at the meeting; providing that the rules expire under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

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**CS/HB 1079 (3R) by the Committee on Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee, Representative Rommel and others—**

**Pub. Rec. and Meetings/Campus Emergency Response for Public Postsecondary Educational Institutions;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for specified portions of campus emergency response for public postsecondary educational institutions; provides exemption from public meetings requirements for meeting held for purposes relating to such portions of campus emergency response; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Substituted for CS/SB 1224(SUB) (Passidomo) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/CS/HB 615, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Government Operations and Technology Appropriations Subcommittee, Careers and Competition Subcommittee, Representative Renner and others—**

**Professional Regulation;** Creates the Occupational Opportunity Act; revises length of time active duty servicemember may remain in good standing with administrative board or program; requires that spouse or surviving spouse be kept in good standing & be exempt from licensure renewal provisions; requires DBPR to issue professional license to spouse or surviving spouse of active duty member; provides requirements related to application, fees, & renewal; provides for fee waiver for specified persons; provides appropriation. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

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**SB 114 (3R) by Senator Brandes—**

**Cosmetic Product Registration;** Deleting the requirement that a person who manufactures, packages, repackages, labels, or relabels a cosmetic in this state register such cosmetic biennially with the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

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**CS/CS/SB 182 (3R) by the Committees on Health Policy, Banking and Insurance, Senator Mayfield and others—**

**Consumer Protection from Nonmedical Changes to Prescription Drug Formularies;** Limiting, under specified circumstances, changes to a health insurance policy prescription drug formulary during a policy year; requiring small employer carriers to limit changes to prescription drug formularies under certain circumstances; limiting, under specified circumstances, changes to a health maintenance contract prescription drug formulary during a contract year, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2018

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**SB 256 (3R) by Senator Steube and others—**

**Florida Center for the Partnerships for Arts Integrated Teaching;** Abrogating the scheduled expiration of the center, etc. Effective Date: 06/30/2017

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**CS/HB 863, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Committee, Representatives Roth and Silvers—**

**Hospice Services;** Exempts certain hospice services in not-for-profit retirement community from specified review & application requirements. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

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**CS/HB 103 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Committee, Representative Cortes, B. and others—**

**Pub. Rec./Nonviable Birth Records;** Provides that certain information included in nonviable birth records is confidential & exempt from public records requirements; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: On the same date that CS/CS/HB 101 or similar legislation takes effect

*Substituted for CS/CS/SB 674(SUB) (Bean) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/CS/HB 101 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Health Quality Subcommittee, Representative Cortes, B. and others—**

**Certificates of Nonviable Birth;** Creates "Grieving Families Act"; authorizes State Registrar of Vital Statistics Office of DOH to electronically receive certificate of nonviable birth; requires DOH to issue certificate of nonviable birth upon request of specified parent; authorizes rulemaking by DOH. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Substituted for SB 672(SUB) (Bean) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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**SB 1094 (3R) by Senator Gainer—**

**Forensic Hospital Diversion Pilot Program;** Authorizing the Department of Children and Families to implement a Forensic Hospital Diversion Pilot Program in Okaloosa County in conjunction with the First Judicial Circuit in Okaloosa County, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Read the second time on April 26, 2017*

*Identical to HB 1051(HC) in the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; Judiciary; and Appropriations*

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**CS/CS/SB 1726, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Agriculture, Senator Montford and others—**

**Industrial Hemp Pilot Projects;** Authorizing the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to oversee the development of industrial hemp pilot projects for the Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences at the University of Florida and the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University; authorizing the universities to develop the pilot projects in partnership with public, nonprofit, and private entities, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Read the second time and amended on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/HB 1347 (3R) by the Committee on Insurance and Banking Subcommittee and Representative Jones—**

**Application of the Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act to Credit Unions;** Exempts credit unions from regulation under Florida Deceptive & Unfair Trade Practices Act. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Substituted for **SB 1620(SUB)** (Powell) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/CS/SB 1604 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Criminal Justice and Senator Bracy—**

**Department of Corrections;** Authorizing the Department of Law Enforcement to issue an investigative demand seeking the production of an inmate's protected health information, medical records, or mental health records under certain circumstances; revising membership requirements for the safety and security review committee appointed by the Department of Corrections; revising scheduling requirements for inspections of state and private correctional institutions and facilities; revising the conditions on which an inmate may be granted a one-time award of 60 additional days of incentive gain-time by the department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Read the second time on April 26, 2017*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 1201(HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Appropriations*

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**CS/CS/SB 1590 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Latvala and others—**

**Coastal Management;** Revising the criteria to be considered by the Department of Environmental Protection in determining and assigning annual funding priorities for beach management and erosion control projects; revising the list of projects that are included as inlet management projects; revising the ranking criteria to be used by the department to establish certain funding priorities for certain inlet-caused beach erosion projects; revising requirements for the comprehensive long-term management plan; requiring certain funds from the Land Acquisition Trust Fund to be used for projects that preserve and repair state beaches, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2017

**Bankruptcy Matters in Foreclosure Proceedings;** Authorizing lienholders to use certain documents as an admission in an action to foreclose a mortgage; requiring a court to take judicial notice of final orders entered in bankruptcy cases, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

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**CS/CS/HB 209, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Health Quality Subcommittee, Representatives Miller, A., Diamond and others—**

**Medical Faculty & Medical Assistant Certification;** Requires DOH to process certain applications for temporary certificate using personal identification number; revises circumstances under which visiting physician may be issued temporary certificate; revises list of schools at which certain faculty members are eligible to receive medical faculty certificate; authorizes certificateholder to practice at certain hospitals; authorizes certain medical directors to request provision of care & treatment; provides requirement for certified medical assistant credential; revises qualifications for employment as medical assistant in certain testing center. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 496(SUB)** (Brandes) and read the second time on April 26, 2017*

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**CS/SB 1108 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Steube—**

**Public Records/Firefighters and their Spouses and Children;** Expanding an exemption from public records requirements for the personal identifying and location information of certain firefighters and their spouses and children to include the personal identifying and location information of former firefighters and their spouses and children, and the names of spouses and children of current and former firefighters; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

**SCR 1360 (SO) by Senator Thurston and others—**

**National Statuary Hall;** Requesting the Joint Committee on the Library of Congress to approve the replacement of the statue of Confederate General Edmund Kirby Smith in the National Statuary Hall Collection with a statue of Mary McLeod Bethune, etc.

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**CS/SB 686 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Baxley—**

**Public Records/Internet Identifiers;** Requiring that electronic mail addresses and Internet identifiers of sexual predators or sexual offenders reported pursuant to specified laws be exempt from public records requirements; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 684 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/CS/SB 198 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Stewart and others—**

**Environmental Regulation Commission;** Requiring the Governor to appoint a new member to the commission within a certain timeframe after the occurrence of a vacancy; requiring certain proposed rules submitted to the commission to receive specified vote totals for approval or modification, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation; the Committee on Ethics and Elections reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

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**SB 762 (SO) by Senator Baxley—**

**Child Protection;** Prohibiting a time-sharing plan from requiring visitation at a recovery residence between specified hours; authorizing a certified recovery residence to allow a minor child to visit a recovery residence, excluding visits during specified hours, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2017

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SCR 920 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Farmer and others—**

**Groveland Four;** Acknowledging the grave injustices perpetrated against Charles Greenlee, Walter Irvin, Samuel Shephard, and Ernest Thomas, who came to be known as “the Groveland Four”; and urging the Governor and Cabinet to perform an expedited clemency review of the cases of Charles Greenlee, Walter Irvin, Samuel Shephard, and Ernest Thomas, including granting full pardons, etc.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

*Identical to CS/HCR 631(HC) in the Committees on Criminal Justice; Judiciary; and Rules*

**CS/CS/SB 766 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Senator Rodriguez and others—**

**Payment Card Offenses;** Revising the offenses of using a scanning device or reencoder with the intent to defraud; prohibiting the use of a skimming device with intent to defraud; prohibiting the possession, sale, or delivery of a skimming device, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2017

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

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**SB 914 (SO) by Senator Baxley—**

**Public Meetings;** Specifying conditions under which members of any board or commission of any state agency or authority or of any agency or authority of any county, municipal corporation, or political subdivision may participate in fact-finding exercises or excursions, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*
