**Keep Our Graduates Working Act;** Prohibits state authority from denying license, refusing to renew license, or suspending or revoking license on basis of delinquency or default in payment of his or her student loan; provides exception to requirement that certain entities prohibit candidate from being examined for or issued, or having renewed license, certificate, or registration to practice health care profession if he or she is listed on specified federal list of excluded individuals & entities; repeals provisions relating to health care practitioners in default on student loan or scholarship obligations. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

#### **SB 2500 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Bradley)—**

**Appropriations;** Providing moneys for the annual period beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, and supplemental appropriations for the period ending June 30, 2020, to pay salaries, and other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, and other improvements, and for other specified purposes of the various agencies of state government, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided herein, this act shall take effect July 1, 2020, or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later; however, if this act becomes law after July 1, 2020, then it shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2020

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**SB 2502 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Bradley)—**

**Implementing the 2020-2021 General Appropriations Act;**

Incorporating by reference certain calculations of the Florida Education Finance Program; suspending the Florida Best and Brightest Teacher and Principal Allocation for the 2020-2021 fiscal year; creating the Teacher Salary Increase Allocation; specifying the source of charter school capital outlay funding; establishing the Florida Institute of Politics at the Florida State University; extending for 1 fiscal year a provision requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to make payments to Medicaid-covered services, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2020; or, if this act fails to become a law until after that date, it shall take effect upon becoming a law and shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2020

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**SB 2504 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Bradley)—**

**State Employees;** Providing for the resolution of collective bargaining issues at impasse between the state and certified bargaining units of state employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

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**SB 2506 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Bradley)—**

**Correctional Medical Authority;** Transferring the State of Florida Correctional Medical Authority from the Executive Office of the Governor to the Department of Health by a type two transfer, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

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**SB 7044 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Hooper)—**

**State-administered Retirement Systems;** Revising required employer retirement contribution rates for each membership class and subclass of the Florida Retirement System; providing a declaration of important state interest, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

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**SB 348 (SO) by Senator Bean and others—**

**Florida Kidcare Program;** Removing the lifetime maximum cap on covered expenses for a child enrolled in the Florida Healthy Kids program, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

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**SB 362 (SO) by Senator Hooper and others—**

**Florida Tourism Marketing;** Revising the scheduled repeal of the Florida Tourism Industry Marketing Corporation direct-support organization; abrogating the scheduled repeal of the Division of Tourism Marketing of Enterprise Florida, Inc., etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

**CS/SB 58 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Book and others—**

**Prescription Drug Donation Repository Program;** Designating the "Prescription Drug Donation Repository Program Act"; creating the program within the Department of Health; prohibiting donations to specific patients; requiring inspection of donated prescription drugs and supplies by a licensed pharmacist; prohibiting the sale of donated prescription drugs and supplies under the program; requiring the department or contractor to establish, maintain, and publish a registry of participating local repositories and available donated prescription drugs and supplies; authorizing the Governor to waive program patient eligibility requirements during a declared state of emergency, etc. Effective Date: This act shall take effect July 1, 2020

**Postsecondary Education for Certain Military Personnel;** Requiring the Board of Governors and the State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of Veterans' Affairs, to create a process for the uniform award of postsecondary credit or career education clock hours to certain servicemembers and veterans of the United States Armed Forces; requiring certain postsecondary institutions to award uniform postsecondary credit or career education clock hours for specified courses taken and occupations held by individuals during their service in the military, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law
