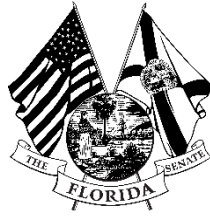

### **HB 7001 (3R) by the Committee on Oversight, Transparency and Public Management Subcommittee and Representative Plasencia—**

**OGSR/E-mail Addresses/Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles;** Removes scheduled repeal of public records exemption for certain e-mail addresses collected by DHSMV. Effective Date: 10/01/2020

*Substituted for **SB 7022(SUB)** (Lee) and read the second time on February 19, 2020*

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### **SB 936 (3R) by Senator Gainer—**

**Disability Retirement Benefits;** Allowing members receiving care at federal Veterans Health Administration facilities to use certification by a specified number of physicians working at such facilities as proof of total and permanent disability for purposes of establishing eligibility for benefits, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Read the second time on February 19, 2020*

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### **CS/SB 838 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Simmons—**

**Business Organizations;** Specifying that certain documents accepted by the Department of State for filing are effective on the date the documents are accepted by the department; revising the required contents of a meeting notice relating to the removal of a director by shareholders; authorizing a domestic corporation to acquire one or more classes or series of shares under certain circumstances; authorizing the department to direct certain interrogatories to certain corporations and to officers or directors of certain corporations, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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### **SB 716 (3R) by Senator Mayfield—**

**County Boundaries;** Revising county boundaries, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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### **SB 540 (3R) by Senator Rader and others—**

**Insurance Guaranty Associations;** Authorizing certain guaranty association employees to adjust losses for the Florida Insurance Guaranty Association if certain conditions are met; redefining the term "net direct written premiums" as "direct written premiums" and revising the definition of that term; deleting a calculation of initial estimated assessments levied by the Office of Insurance Regulation on insurers in the Florida Insurance Guaranty Association; deleting a calculation of initial estimated assessments levied by the office on insurers in the Florida Workers' Compensation Insurance Guaranty Association, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Read the second time on February 19, 2020*

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### **CS/CS/SB 346, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Senator Bradley and others—**

**Criminal Justice;** Prohibiting the imprisonment for longer than a certain time for persons who possess, purchase, or possess with the intent to purchase less than specified amounts of certain substances; authorizing a court to impose a sentence other than the mandatory minimum term of imprisonment and mandatory fine for a person convicted of trafficking if the court makes certain findings on the record; deleting eligibility requirements relating to a person's conduct before the person's wrongful conviction or incarceration, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Read the second time and amended on February 19, 2020*

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### **CS/HB 73 (3R) by the Committee on State Affairs Committee, Representative Overdorf and others—**

**Environmental Regulation;** Specifies requirements for contracts between residential recycling collectors or recovered materials processing facilities & counties or municipalities for collecting, transporting, & processing residential recycling material & contaminated recyclable material; prohibits local governments from requiring further verification from DEP for certain projects; revises types of dock & pier replacements & repairs that are exempt from such verification & certain permitting requirements. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Substituted for **CS/SB 326(SUB)** (Perry) and read the second time on February 19, 2020*

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### **CS/HB 101 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce Committee, Representative Andrade and others—**

**Public Construction;** Revises amounts of retainage that local governmental entities & contractors may withhold from progress payments for construction services contract; revises requirements for DMS rules governing certain contracts; revises amounts of retainage that public entities & contractors may withhold from progress payments for construction services contract. Effective Date: 10/01/2020

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### **CS/CS/HB 61 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Children, Families and Seniors Subcommittee, Representatives Roth, Daniels and others—**

**Adoption Benefits;** Provides eligibility to certain veterans & servicemembers for specified adoption benefits. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

### **CS/SB 1482 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Bean—**

**Domestic Violence Services;** Revising the duties of the Department of Children and Families in relation to the domestic violence program; repealing a provision relating to the duties and functions of the Florida Coalition Against Domestic Violence with respect to domestic violence; revising the requirements of domestic violence centers; removing the coalition from the capital improvement grant program process, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations*

## SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

### **SB 88 (2R) by Senator Stewart and others—**

**Child Care Facilities;** Citing this act at the "Child Safety Alarm Act"; requiring that, by a specified date, vehicles used by child care facilities and large family child care homes to transport children be equipped with a reliable alarm system that prompts the driver to inspect the vehicle for children before exiting the vehicle; requiring the Department of Children and Families to adopt by rule minimum safety standards for such systems and to maintain a list of approved alarm manufacturers and alarm systems, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Infrastructure and Security; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

### **CS/SB 100 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Harrell and others—**

**Dispensing Medicinal Drugs;** Authorizing certain hospitals to dispense supplies of prescribed medicinal drugs in a specified amount to emergency department patients or inpatients upon discharge under certain circumstances; authorizing a greater specified supply of medicinal drugs to be prescribed and dispensed in areas in which a state of emergency has been declared and is in effect; authorizing a prescriber to provide a patient with a prescription for medicinal drugs beyond the initial prescription period under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

### **CS/SB 128 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Wright—**

**Public Records/Judicial Assistants;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain identifying and location information of current and former judicial assistants and their spouses and children; providing for retroactive application of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

### **CS/CS/CS/SB 140 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Banking and Insurance, Community Affairs, Senator Hutson and others—**

**Fireworks;** Defining the term "designated holiday"; providing an exemption for the use of fireworks solely and exclusively during a designated holiday, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

### **SJR 142 (2R) by Senator Brandes and others—**

**Abolishing the Constitution Revision Commission;** Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to abolish the Constitution Revision Commission, etc.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

### **CS/SB 154 (2R) by the Committee on Education, Senator Thurston and others—**

**Human Trafficking Education in Schools;** Revising the required health education in public schools to include information regarding the dangers and signs of human trafficking; specifying the minimum requirements of the human trafficking education portion of the comprehensive health education curriculum, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

### **SB 248 (2R) by Senator Hooper—**

**Public Records/County Attorneys and Assistant County Attorneys;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for the personal identifying and location information of current and former county attorneys and assistant county attorneys and the names and personal identifying and location information of the spouses and children of such attorneys; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

### **CS/SB 290 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Hooper—**

**School Bus Safety;** Revising civil penalties for certain violations relating to stopping for a school bus, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2021

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Infrastructure and Security; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 292 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Broxson—**

**Insurance Claims Data;** Defining the terms “loss run statement” and “provide”; requiring surplus lines and authorized insurers, respectively, to provide insureds either a loss run statement or certain information within a certain timeframe after receipt of the insured’s written request; requiring insurers to provide notice to the agent of record after providing a loss run statement; prohibiting insurers from charging a fee to prepare and provide one loss run statement annually, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2021

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Commerce and Tourism reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 294 (2R) by Senator Wright and others—**

**Crimes Against Veterans;** Citing this act as the "Florida Veterans Protection Act"; providing an enhanced sentence for any person who commits aggravated white collar crimes against a certain number of veterans by obtaining or attempting to obtain a specified amount of money; providing criminal penalties, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Space; reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/SB 352 (2R) by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Space and Senator Hutson—**

**Unlawful Use of Uniforms, Medals, or Insignia;** Prohibiting certain misrepresentations concerning military service when made for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2020

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Space; the Committee on Ethics and Elections reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 372 (2R) by the Committee on Education, Senator Lee and others—**

**Postsecondary Education for Certain Military Personnel;** Requiring the Board of Governors and the State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of Veterans’ Affairs, to create a process for the uniform award of postsecondary credit or career education clock hours to certain servicemembers and veterans of the United States Armed Forces; requiring certain postsecondary institutions to award uniform postsecondary credit or career education clock hours for specified courses taken and occupations held by individuals during their service in the military, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Space; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 374 (2R) by Senator Rouson—**

**Housing Discrimination;** Removing housing discrimination as a cause of action for certain relief and damages stemming from violations of the Florida Civil Rights Act of 1992; revising the conditions under which an aggrieved person may commence a civil action in any appropriate court against a specified respondent to enforce specified rights; authorizing, rather than requiring, a civil action to commence within a specified period after an alleged discriminatory housing practice, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 384 (2R) by Senator Baxley—**

**Harris Chain of Lakes;** Repealing provisions relating to the Harris Chain of Lakes Restoration Council, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**SJR 396 (2R) by Senator Rodriguez—**

**Single-subject Limitation for Taxation and Budget Reform Commission;** Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to require that any proposals to revise the State Constitution, or any part thereof, filed by the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission be limited to a single subject, etc.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/SB 426 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Montford and others—**

**Regional Rural Development Grants;** Specifying that the concept of building the professional capacity of a regional economic development organization includes the hiring of professional staff to perform specified services; providing that matching grants may be used to provide technical assistance to local governments and economic development organizations and to existing and prospective businesses; increasing the amount of funds the Department of Economic Opportunity may expend each fiscal year from the Rural Community Development Revolving Loan Fund for certain purposes; revising the maximum percentage of total infrastructure project costs for which the department may award grants, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Committee on Innovation, Industry, and Technology; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

**SB 486 (2R) by Senator Bradley—**

**Florida Best and Brightest Programs;** Repealing provisions relating to the Florida Best and Brightest Teacher Program and the Florida Best and Brightest Principal Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

**CS/SB 604 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Bean—**

**Servicemembers Civil Relief Act;** Revising the definition of the terms “abandoned” or “abandonment”; providing that certain state laws relating to children do not supersede the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act; requiring the Department of Children and Families to ensure that the act is observed in certain cases, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 630 (2R) by Senator Mayfield and others—**

**Regulation of Smoking;** Authorizing municipalities and counties to further restrict smoking within the boundaries of certain public parks, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Innovation, Industry, and Technology; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 828 (2R) by Senator Benacquisto—**

**Florida ABLE Program;** Abrogating the future repeal of provisions relating to the Florida ABLE program, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 830 (2R) by Senator Benacquisto—**

**OGSR/Certain Personal Financial and Health Information;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain personal financial and health information held by the Florida Prepaid College Board, Florida ABLE, Inc., or the Florida ABLE program, or an agent or service provider thereof; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/CS/SB 994 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary, Senator Passidomo and others—**

**Guardianship;** Expanding factors for a court to consider when appointing a guardian; revising requirements for a petition for the appointment of a guardian; prohibiting professional guardians from petitioning for their own appointment except under certain circumstances; prohibiting guardians from taking certain actions on behalf of an alleged incapacitated person or minor, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 1224 (2R) by Senator Simmons and others—**

**Real Estate Conveyances;** Providing that subscribing witnesses are not required to validate certain instruments conveying a leasehold interest in real property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 1292 (2R) by Senator Perry—**

**Public Records/Nonjudicial Arrest Record of a Minor;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for a nonjudicial record of the arrest of a minor who has successfully completed a diversion program; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 700 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*
