

#### Florida Constitution standards

#### **Article III, Section 16—**The legislature...shall apportion the state:

- 30 to 40 consecutively numbered senatorial districts of either contiguous, overlapping or identical territory.
- 80 to 120 consecutively numbered house districts of either contiguous, overlapping or identical territory.

#### Article III, Sections 20 and 21—In establishing...district boundaries:

- a) No apportionment plan or... district shall be drawn with the intent to favor or disfavor a political party or an incumbent; and districts shall not be drawn with the intent or result of denying or abridging the equal opportunity of racial or language minorities to participate in the political process or to diminish their ability to elect representatives of their choice; and districts shall consist of contiguous territory.
- b) Unless compliance with the standards in this subsection conflicts with the standards in subsection (a) or with federal law, districts shall be as nearly equal in population as is practicable; districts shall be compact; and districts shall, where feasible, utilize existing political and geographical boundaries.
- c) The order in which the standards within subsections (a) and (b) of this section are set forth shall not be read to establish any priority of one standard over the other within that subsection.

### Direct path the new districts for 2012

The 60-day regular session convenes January 10, 2012.

Legislature adopts a *joint resolution* apportioning the state into **senate** and **house** districts.

Within 15 days, Attorney General petitions the Supreme Court to determine the validity of plans.

Within 30 days, Supreme Court upholds senate and house plans.

Within 60 days, U.S. Justice Department preclears senate and house plans.


Legislature enacts a *bill* (an Act) establishing 27 **congressional** districts.

Within 7 days after Act presented to Governor for approval (15 days if after March 2), congressional plan becomes law.

Within 60 days, U.S. Justice Department preclears congressional plan.



















































































## Population per district in Florida...



## PCS congressional districts...

- Decreases city splits; follows city boundaries;
- Incorporates feedback from the public and supervisors of elections (remove coastal Charlotte County from rural district; modify boundary of Hispanic opportunity district in central Florida; adjust boundaries of districts bordering Tampa Bay; Alachua County); and
- Follows geographic boundaries (bays, rivers, major roadways, and etc.).

#### PCS state senate districts...

- Decreases county and city splits; follows city boundaries; lowers population deviations;
- Incorporates feedback from the public and supervisors of elections (e.g., The Villages, Golden Triangle, Wahneta, Palatka);
- Follows geographic boundaries (bays, rivers, major roadways, and etc.), and
- Assigns odd- and even-numbered districts in an equitable manner.

# Concensus on open, transparent, and inclusive process...

- November 1, 2011 deadline for maps submitted by Senators or the public;
- Use bill templates from 9/22/11 meeting;
- Use counties, VTDs, and census blocks;
- Publish committee maps 7 calendar days prior to meetings; amendments 2 days prior; and floor amendments 4 days prior.

## Consensus on directions for maps...

- Coastal/rural alignment in northwest Florida;
- Focus first on maintaining minority districts that perform and preserving minority voting rights, taking traditional, race neutral redistricting principles into account;
- Follow other standards in Amendments 5 and 6 where not in conflict with Tier 1 standards;
- Avoid linking urban areas on opposite coasts in a single district.
