The bridge serves as the single point of access and hurricane evacuation route to residents in the community. Once the bridge has been replaced, residents will have a reliable evacuation route in the event of a hurricane or other significant weather event.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A collapse could cause potential harm to residents, leaving them stranded in the event of a severe weather event. Once the design and permitting have been completed, the existing bridge will be replaced with a new resilient structure.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The bridge serves as the single point of access and hurricane evacuation route to several residents in the island community.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Once the bridge has been replaced, residents will have a reliable evacuation route in the event of a hurricane or other significant weather event.
