14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of the project is to construct a new Police and Fire facility, which will also serve as the City of Treasure Island's (City) primary Emergency Operations Center. The City is proposing to relocate the building to a more central location in the City to decrease response times and to provide a greater public presence. The facility's construction will be sustainable and will result in a more resilient building.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The scope of work for the project includes public outreach, design, construction, and construction management. City funds will be used for design and construction management services. Requested funds will go towards the construction phase.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Redesign and construction of the Public Safety facility enhance the City of Treasure Island's ability to recruit and retain Police and Fire staff, which will allow the City to provide a higher level of service. By relocating the facility to the downtown area, Fire emergency response times are reduced by approximately 15%. Additionally, the Police Department will provide a greater level of positive, proactive engagement on foot with City residents, tourists and businesses. This project also provides a long-term benefit to the City to enhance sustainability and climate-related resiliency efforts as the City plans for rising sea levels and an increase in potential storms. In times of natural disasters, the City government will be able to resume operations more expeditiously.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project benefits the entire City of Treasure Island community, including approximately 6,700 City residents, hundreds of seasonal residents, over 20,000 visitors each year, hundreds of businesses and recreational services.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Emergency management response times will be significantly reduced. The relocation of the facility will make people feel safer downtown and police personnel will provide a greater public presence in the busiest section of the City of Treasure Island (City). The visibility of the new Police Station on the City's main thoroughfare will provide increased traffic and pedestrian safety. The project should result in fewer accidents within view of the facility.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The City of Treasure Island is diligent in ensuring that all project deliverables are met within required time frames. If an issue is anticipated, the City will coordinate with the Department in advance to make any necessary adjustments.
