14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The Osceola Recovery Project (ORP) exists to help people living in Osceola County achieve recovery from substance abuse without judgment or stigma. We serve as a knowledgeable referral source by connecting individuals to recovery services. To achieve this, we work closely with local government policy makers, businesses, provider agencies, law enforcement, and other nonprofits to provide information and direct people to reputable and successful recovery organizations. Thus, the primary goal is to reduce substance abuse in Osceola County and promote recovery. Research shows that it is difficult for people suffering from substance use disorder to navigate the recovery community. The ORP intends to serve as a one-stop shop for anyone struggling with a substance use disorder, and their families.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

- -Innovate by creating and sustaining youth drug prevention programs.
- -Specifically target opioid and stimulant abuse, which evidence shows to be the most prevalent.
- -Increase member and organization competencies through coalition building activities.
- -By 2024, ensure membership of all 12 community sectors within Osceola County.
- -Conduct research through qualitative and quantitative means to adjust services from year to year.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

- -Serve as a hub for people searching for viable and reliable means for recovery.
- -Peer to peer counseling.
- -Memorandums of Understanding between ORP and other recovery-based organizations in order to streamline people obtaining the correct services.
- -Educational materials will be produced for distribution throughout the county.
- -Online education modules will be created to bring awareness and education for prospective recovery candidates.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Youth and adults in Osceola County will be the target audience. Although the ORP intends to help those who seek services, the main goal is to prevent substance use disorder by creating awareness and education.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Osceola Recovery Project intends to fulfill a need for a drug free coalition. Currently, Osceola County is the only county in the state of Florida that does not have a functioning coalition. As one of the largest counties, it is essential to fill this gap in order to function as a one stop shop for those who are seeking help with substance use disorder. Moreover, work towards prevention will show a drop in substance abuse-related issues. The ORP, by conducting empirical research, intends to reduce substance use disorder by 10% after a baseline has been established.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The ORP is fully prepared to return any outstanding funding if the goals are not achieved.
