**4. Project/Program Description**

The City of Blountstown is seeking funds to clean up Lake Hilda, which lies in the center of the City. Lake Hilda serves as a major receiver of storm water for nearly half of the City of Blountstown through runoff to the Lake and upstream creek. The Lake is managed by the City through a gate dam system, allowing the water to flow into Sutton Creek towards the Apalachicola River. These funds will be used to purchase sections of Lake Hilda, dredge existing muck, and remove fallen trees and vegetation that has built up since Hurricane Michael. The excess build up causes a flooding hazard by taking up space that is normally filled water, and leaving less capacity in the Lake for major storm events. Having a greater capacity in the Lake will allow the City to manage the water to prevent potential flooding.

### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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These funds will be used to purchase sections of Lake Hilda, dredge existing muck, and remove fallen trees and vegetation that has built up since Hurricane Michael. The excess build up causes a flooding hazard by taking up space that is normally filled with storm water from the surrounding drainage basin, which covers nearly half of the City. The water from Lake Hilda is controlled by a gate dam system. The water flows through the dam into Sutton Creek, which flows to the Apalachicola River.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

Lake Hilda is fed from a small creek and stormwater from the surrounding drainage basin, and flows into Sutton Creek which connects to the Apalachicola River. The water level in the Lake is controlled by the City's dam on the South end of the Lake. Cleaning the Lake will help prevent flooding of homes near the Lake and near Sutton Creek.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

Dredging and removing unwanted materials in Lake Hilda will allow for a greater volume of water to reside in the Lake. A greater capacity will allow the City to better control the water levels of the Lake and manage the amount of water that flows through the dam into the creek below, lessening the opportunity for flooding.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

The target population includes the homes and families that live on Lake Hilda and those that live down-stream of Lake Hilda that may be in the path of possible flooding. 25-50 individuals

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

Removing excess muck and debris will allow Lake Hilda to have the capacity to hold more stormwater from the surrounding drainage basin and creek. This project will bring Lake Hilda back close to pre-Hurricane Michael conditions. The water levels and operation of the dam will be controlled by the City.

The City will work with the contracting agency to determine applicable measures, should funding be made available.
