## CS/HB 347 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary Committee and Representative Truenow—

Exemptions from Products Liability Actions; Specifies circumstances under which products liability actions may not be brought against agricultural employers, distributors, dealers, or applicators. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read the second time on March 5, 2024

### HB 931, 1st Eng. (3R) by Representatives McClain, Daniels and others—

**School Chaplains**; Authorizes school districts & charter schools to adopt policy to allow volunteer school chaplains; requires district school boards & charter school governing boards to assign specified duties to such volunteer school chaplains; requires volunteer school chaplains to meet certain background screening requirements; requires school districts and charter schools to publish specified information under certain circumstances. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Substituted for **CS/SB 1044(SUB)** (Grall) and read the second time on March 6, 2024

#### CS/CS/HB 49 (3R) by the Committees on Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee, Representative Chaney and others—

Employment and Curfew of Minors; Revises certain employment restrictions for minors 16 & 17 years of age; revises age at which employment restrictions apply; requires curfew adopted by county or municipal ordinance to include certain exceptions. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read the second time and amended on March 6, 2024

CS/CS/HB 165 (SO) by the Committees on Health & Human Services Committee, Water Quality, Supply & Treatment Subcommittee, Representatives Gossett-Seidman, Cross and others—

Sampling of Beach Waters and Public Bathing Spaces; Revises provisions related to bacteriological sampling of beach waters & public bathing places, including rule adoption & enforcement; issuance of health advisories; closure of beach waters & public bathing places; & notification & signage requirements. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

### HB 533 (SO) by Representative Fabricio and others—

**DNA Samples from Inmates;** Requires certain inmates to submit DNA samples. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

# HB 7043 (SO) by the Committee on Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee, Representative Arrington and others—

**OGSR/Agency Personnel Information**; Removes scheduled repeal of exemption from public records requirements for certain personal identifying & location information of specified agency personnel & spouses & children thereof. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

## CS/SB 7074 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Finance and Tax (Ingoglia)—

Taxation; Prohibiting a plan for tourist development from allocating more than a certain percentage of the tax revenue to a publicly owned and operated convention center for certain purposes, unless approved by a supermajority vote; providing that a taxpayer has a right to know certain information regarding property determined not to have been entitled to a homestead exemption; revising the definition of the term "renewable energy source device"; providing that taxpayers are not responsible for specified payments in certain circumstances; revising conditions for when multifamily projects are considered property used for a charitable purpose and are eligible to receive an ad valorem property tax exemption; revising the value to which a certain ad valorem property tax exemption applies, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

### CS/SB 1784 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Grall—

Mental Health and Substance Abuse; Providing an exception to background screening requirements for certain licensed physicians and nurses; authorizing the state to establish that a transfer evaluation was performed by providing the court with a copy of the evaluation before the close of the state's case-in-chief; allowing a patient's legal custodian to authorize release of the patient's clinical records; revising requirements for ordering a person for involuntary services and treatment, petitions for involuntary service, appointment of counsel, and continuances of hearings, respectively, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Similar to CS/CS/HB 7021, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

# CS/SB 1640 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Collins—

Payments for Health Care Services; Establishing a 3-year statute of limitations for an action to collect medical debt for services rendered by certain health care facilities; providing additional personal property exemptions from legal process for medical debts resulting from services provided in certain licensed facilities; requiring certain licensed facilities to post on their respective websites a consumer-friendly list of standard charges for a minimum number of shoppable health care services, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Similar to HB 7089, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

# CS/CS/HB 1181 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Jacques and others—

Juvenile Justice; Revises penalties for minors committing firearms violations; redesignates civil citation programs as delinquency citation programs; requires child on probation for felony firearm offense who is taken into custody be placed in secure detention; requires specified sanctions for certain children adjudicated for firearms offenses; requires DJJ to create graduated response matrix to hold youths accountable for probation & conditional release terms; authorizes exception to revocation or suspension of driving privileges in certain circumstances; requires DJJ to establish specified class for firearms offenders; revises provisions concerning introduction of contraband into DJJ facilities. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1274(SUB)** (Martin) and read the second time on March 5, 2024. Temporarily postponed with pending amendment #1 (374600).

#### HB 191 (LB) by Representative Brackett-

**Town of Orchid, Indian River County;** Provides exception to general law; authorizes the Town of Orchid in Indian River County to hold public meetings within specified mileage of its jurisdictional boundary under certain circumstances. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 509 (LB) by Representative Melo-

Collier Mosquito Control District, Collier County; Amends district boundaries. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

#### HB 691 (LB) by Representative Shoaf-

Town of Horseshoe Beach, Dixie County; Provides exception to general law; requires Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco of DBPR to issue special alcoholic beverage license to certain restaurants which meet space, seating, & minimum gross revenue requirements; provides conditions for revocation of such license or denial of pending application for such license. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 741 (LB) by Representative LaMarca-

Town of Hillsboro Beach, Broward County; Requires Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco of DBPR to issue special alcoholic beverage license to residential condominium that meets certain requirements; limits issuance of such license & provision & sale of alcoholic beverages under such license; authorizes division to regulate & supervise residential condominiums to which such licenses have been issued; authorizes division to revoke or suspend such licenses. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### CS/HB 755 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Representatives Sirois and Brackett—

Canaveral Port District, Brevard County; Revises Charter of Canaveral Port District, Brevard County; provides for increase in amount of levied tax permitted to be used for payment of principal & interest on revenue certificates & bonds; requires port authority to take reasonable measures to support Commercial Space Launch Industry & to submit annual report. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

# CS/HB 793 (LB) by the Committee on Constitutional Rights, Rule of Law & Government Operations Subcommittee and Representative Daley—

Coral Springs Improvement District, Broward County; Prohibits board of supervisors of district from receiving bids on certain contracts; provides exception; requires board to comply with certain statutory bidding procedures; authorizes board to reject all bids if such rejection is in best interests of district; provides that competitive bidding for certain contracts is subject to statutory provisions; authorizes district to apply to DMS to purchase certain commodities & contractual services. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 819 (LB) by Representative Esposito and others—

Lehigh Acres Municipal Services Improvement District, Hendry and Lee Counties; Expands territorial boundaries of district. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

#### CS/HB 821 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee and Representative Altman—

**Melbourne-Tillman Water Control District, Brevard County;** Revises maximum stormwater management user fees for residential, agricultural, & commercial parcels of land. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

#### HB 823 (LB) by Representative Maney—

North Okaloosa Fire District, Okaloosa County; Authorizes Board of Fire Commissioners of district to establish schedule of impact fees for new construction within its jurisdictional boundaries; provides for use of such impact fees; requires recordkeeping; authorizes agreements with general purpose local governments for certain purposes. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

# CS/HB 867 (LB) by the Committee on State Affairs Committee and Representative Robinson, W.—

North River Ranch Improvement Stewardship District, Manatee County; Revises boundaries of district. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 897 (LB) by Representative Maney and others-

Dorcas Fire District, Okaloosa County; Provides that district is dependent special district; removes provisions relating to district's status as independent special district; provides that Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners or its appointees shall serve as governing board; removes provisions relating to duties, election, terms, compensation, & meetings of district board of commissioners; removes requirement that resolution or ordinance adopted by board & approved by referendum only be repealed by referendum; authorizes district to assess ad valorem taxes & non-ad valorem assessments, & to impose & foreclose non-ad valorem assessment liens, as authorized by law; removes board's authority to enter into certain agreements; revises rate of assessment of non-ad valorem assessments; provides that expansion & merger of district shall be ratified by board. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1023 (LB) by Representative Trabulsy and others—

St. Lucie County; Provides an exception to general law; limits compensation to health care provider that provides medical services for inmate housed in St. Lucie County detention center if provider does not have contract with county to provide such services; limits compensation to entity that provides emergency medical transportation services for inmate housed in St. Lucie County detention center if entity does not have contract with county to provide such services. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1025 (LB) by Representative Stevenson—

Municipal Service District of Ponte Vedra Beach, St. Johns County; Revises provisions relating to terms of office of District Trustees; revises capital expenditure amount required to be approved by voters of district; revises authority of district to approve such expenditure; revises limitation on amount of district's contingency reserves. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

#### HB 1115 (LB) by Representative Buchanan—

Three Rivers Stewardship District, Sarasota County; Revises boundaries of district. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1117 (LB) by Representative Buchanan—

City of North Port, Sarasota County; Creates Star Farms Village at North Port Stewardship District; establishes boundaries; provides for board of supervisors & election, membership, terms, meetings, & duties of board; provides method for transition of board from landowner control to control by resident electors; provides for district manager & treasurer; provides general & special powers of district; provides for bonds, borrowing, future ad valorem taxation, special assessments, issuance of certificates of indebtedness, & tax liens; provides for fees & charges; provides for referendum. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### CS/CS/HB 1165 (LB) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee and Representative Abbott—

**Town of Sneads, Jackson County;** Transfers real property from Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund to Town Council of Town of Sneads; provides requirements for use & sale or disposition of real property; requires conveyance of real property by specified date. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1483 (LB) by Representative Chaney—

Pinellas County Construction Licensing Board, Pinellas County; Revises board membership; revises commencement & expiration of terms; removes provisions relating to registration; removes obsolete funding & certification provisions; removes provisions requiring code compliance bond & proof of certain liability insurance as conditions for certification. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### CS/HB 1571 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Representative Mooney and others—

Florida Keys Aqueduct Authority, Monroe County; Removes provision prohibiting combination of water system with sewer system within geographic boundaries of authority for purposes of financing. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

### HB 1573, 1st Eng. (LB) by Representative Andrade and others—

Pace Fire Rescue District, Santa Rosa County; Removes district's authority to levy & collect ad valorem taxes; establishes maximum rates for non-ad valorem assessments; provides exception to general law relating to initial levy of non-ad valorem assessments. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1575, 1st Eng. (LB) by Representative Andrade and others—

Avalon Beach-Mulat Fire Protection District, Santa Rosa County; Removes district's authority to levy ad valorem taxes; establishes maximum rates for non-ad valorem assessments; provides exception to general law relating to initial levy of non-ad valorem assessments. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

## HB 1577, 1st Eng. (LB) by Representative Andrade and others—

Midway Fire District, Santa Rosa County; Removes district's authority to levy ad valorem taxes; establishes maximum rates for non-ad valorem assessments; provides exception to general law relating to initial levy of non-ad valorem assessments. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

### CS/CS/SB 438 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs and Senator Ingoglia—

**Term Limits;** Requiring specified counties to hold a certain referendum election on a specified date; authorizing certain counties to hold additional referendum elections that coincide with any future general election under specified circumstances; establishing term limits for county commissioners; prohibiting initiatives or referendum processes regarding term limits which are not specifically provided for by the act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

#### SB 468 (2R) by Senator Bradley-

**Court Interpreter Services;** Authorizing the state courts system to use state revenues, if available, to provide court-appointed interpreting services to nonindigent individuals; repealing the cost recovery requirement for court-appointed interpreting services, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

#### CS/CS/SB 472 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Brodeur and others—

Suits Against the Government; Increasing the statutory limits on liability for tort claims against the state and its agencies and subdivisions; prohibiting a party from lobbying against any agreed upon settlement brought to the Legislature as a claim bill; requiring the Department of Financial Services, beginning on a specified date and every 5 years thereafter, to adjust the limitations of liability for claims, not to exceed a certain percentage for each such adjustment, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

#### SB 732 (2R) by Senator Powell-

Theft from Nonprofit Organizations; Providing for the reclassification of certain theft offenses of specified amounts from nonprofit organizations; requiring in certain cases that the judge require restitution and community service in addition to any fine or sentence imposed, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

### CS/SB 1276 (2R) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Collins—

Litigation Financing; Citing this act as the "Litigation Investment Safeguards and Transparency Act"; requiring a court's consideration of potential conflicts of interest which may arise from the existence of a litigation financing agreement in specified circumstances; prohibiting specified acts by litigation financiers; requiring certain disclosures related to litigation financing agreements and the involvement of foreign persons, foreign principals, or sovereign wealth funds; requiring the indemnification of specified fees, costs, and sanctions by a litigation financier in specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1422 (2R) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, Senator Burgess and others—

**Food Recovery**; Directing the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, subject to legislative appropriation, to implement a program to provide incentives to food producers to sell high-quality fresh food products to food recovery entities at a discounted price; requiring food recovery entities to negotiate with food producers; requiring the department to reimburse food recovery entities for certain costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1432 (2R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Book—

Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children; Requiring the Department of Children and Families to include individual-level child placement assessment data in its annual report to the Legislature on the commercial sexual exploitation of children; requiring the department to provide the Legislature with individual-level child placement assessment data in a certain format, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

#### SB 1448 (2R) by Senator Gruters-

**Transparency in Social Media;** Designating the "Transparency in Social Media Act"; requiring foreign-adversary-owned entities operating social media platforms in the state to publicly disclose specified information in a certain manner; requiring foreign-adversary-owned entities operating social media platforms to implement a user verification system for certain entities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

### CS/CS/SB 1566 (2R) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Regulated Industries and Senator Hutson—

Fees/Fantasy Sports Contest Operator; Requiring applicants for a fantasy sports contest operator license to pay a specified application fee; requiring contest operators to pay a specified annual license renewal fee; prohibiting such fees from exceeding a specified amount; requiring applicants and contest operators to provide certain written evidence; requiring contest operators to remit certain fees, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 1568 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

#### SB 1568 (2R) by Senator Hutson-

Fantasy Sports Contest Amusement Act; Designating the "Fantasy Sports Contest Amusement Act"; requiring the Florida Gaming Control Commission to enforce and administer the act; providing application requirements for fantasy sports contest operator licenses; requiring a contest operator to implement specified consumer protection procedures; requiring contest operators to keep and maintain certain records for a specified period, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

#### SB 1786 (2R) by Senator DiCeglie-

**Professional Licensure and Certification;** Authorizing the practice of a profession as a substitute for certain professional or occupational degrees for certain foreign-trained professionals; revising education and work experience requirements for taking the surveyor and mapper licensure examination, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

#### SB 7076 (2R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax (Ingoglia)-

**Transportation Network Companies**; Prohibiting an airport or a seaport from charging a transportation network company pickup fees for a certain purpose which are greater than a certain amount, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations
