a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Improve the function and aesthetics of the canal system that runs through the entire Village. Removing muck deepens the useful area of the canal, allowing for better navigation and increased water storage. The muck gives the water a rotting odor and cloudiness, while allowing plants to become overgrown.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Remove approximately 8,500 CY of fine grained silty sand and organics.



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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Increased aesthetics and usability of the canal system from increasing the cross-sectional area of the canal and removing the cause of rotting odor. Increased flood protection due to the increased storm water storage area.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is all residents of the Village of Royal Palm Beach and residents of adjacent communities connected to the canal system, estimated to be 80,000 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is reduced muck and exotic vegetation. A survey will show the expanded depth, once material has been removed.
