Lake Clarke no longer meets state water quality standards. The Town is proposing to decrease the pollution in Lake Clarke by addressing stormwater and wastewater system deficiencies and in the process upgrade the water system to improve fire flow and fire protection. The project includes replacing 6900 feet of asbestos cement pipe with new PVC pipe, creating 7000 feet of stormwater swales, and installing 8300 feet of sanitary sewers. The project is permitted and ready to start. The Town of Lake Clarke Shores is proposing a 50/50 cost share.
