The purpose of renovating the former library building on campus is to provide state of the art classrooms and laboratories to support our Nursing and Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) programs. On a local scale, Webber's Health Science programs will serve the community's need for qualified trained nurses and OTAs. Webber's goal is to provide access to healthcare education in Southeast Polk County that would otherwise be limited to residents in the area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

On a local scale, Webber's Health Science program will serve the community in need of qualified trained nurses and OTA. We will provide access to healthcare education in Southeast Polk County that would otherwise be limited to residents in the area.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Webber has been approved to admit up to 36 nursing students and 24 OTA students per cohort per semester, producing 72 nursing graduates and 48 OTA graduates per year. The funding of this project will provide the institution the ability to provide citizens in the region an opportunity to access quality education to further close the gap on critical workforce needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

University/College students will be the intended population. The project will serve between 100-200 students a year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will provide a learning environment for healthcare practitioners that is currently not present in Southeast Polk County. The classrooms and labs will provide students an opportunity to master patient care skills that will prepare them for their industry exams and access to gainful employment.

The facility will allow the institution to provide economic self sufficiency to 120 individuals a year. The institution plans on graduating 72 nurses and 48 OTA per year.

Outcomes will be measured through: a) Program graduation rates; b) Licensure exam pass rates; and c) Graduate employment rates.
