4. Project/Program Description

The requested funds will be used for the construction of the third phase of 4-laning Old Kings Rd. between Farnum Lane and Forest Grove Drive. This project is needed to improve road capacity, reduce traffic congestion, improve safety for motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists on the corridor. Additionally, Old Kings Rd. connects two principal arterials with access to Interstate-95. The widening will also improve evacuation during a natural disaster and/or emergency since Old Kings Rd. serves as a parallel route to I-95 as well as a connecting road to the I-95/Palm Coast Parkway Interchange, and I-95/Matanzas Woods Pkwy. Interchange.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The requested funds will improve capacity of Old Kings Rd. from a 2-lane to 4-lane roadway with turn lanes at appropriate intersections. In addition to the capacity improvements for motor vehicles, the project will include safety improvements for bicyclists and pedestrians (sidewalks and streetlights), aesthetic improvements for the community (landscaping), and improved air and water quality, respectively, through reduction in congestion and treatment of stormwater runoff.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds will fund the construction of a project as described above.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The end result of the project will include a reduction in traffic congestion, a safer corridor for bicyclists and pedestrians, improved aesthetics for the community, as well as improved environmental conditions (reduced air pollution due to reduction in congestion as well as stormwater treatment of water runoff).

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Old Kings Rd. is a multi-county roadway that extends from Volusia County to Flagler County. The completed project will directly benefit residents and businesses along the corridor. However, there is also an added benefit that during emergency closures of I-95, Old Kings Rd. serves as a parallel corridor to serve north-south traffic.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of the project will be the additional capacity created by a widening of the roadway. This outcome may be measured by road capacity Level of Service (LOS).

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
