14. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Florida hemp pilot projects found that locally adapted fiber hemp can be used for local production, local processing, and seed sales to northern growers, which can bring millions of dollars into the state. Funding would allow an R2 HBCU to finalize development of the first Florida hemp variety, provide extension, and market test fiber hemp products. This work is crucial to bridge the gap from pilot project results to an active hemp market, while accelerating the HBCU towards R1 status.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Finalization and publicization of Florida bred varieties of fiber and grain type hemp, along with publication of growing practices. From this funding we will be able to finalize preliminary efforts to breed a variety of hemp that produces well in our state. That variety will be able to be certified for This will be done in coordination with university partners, seed agencies, and local growers that will be licensed to grow the approved hemp variety.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services from this appropriation will be indirect as we are providing infrastructure for a new industry that can employ hundreds of thousands of workers in the state.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The agricultural sector involved in the seed industry, manufacturing, wood processing would be aided by the expansion of hemp seed production. The more than 250,000 Floridians working in this sector can be positively effected by the addition of hemp as a secure alternative to some other volatile markets Florida growers have exposure to.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Founding a local seed industry that sells seed for fiber production in state and throughout the country, which brings money into the state.

Success will be measure by tons of seed produced, acers of fiber grown in state, tons of seed sold to out-of-state-growers, and estimated cash flow into the state generated from seed sales outside the state. These outcomes will be measured by survey of industry participants and validated by USDA ag reports to ensure concordant, trustworthy information.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Immediate refund of remaining funds upon identification of unsatisfactory progress.
