SB 184 (3R) by Senator Avila and others—

Impeding, Threatening, or Harassing First Responders; Defining the terms “first responder” and “harass”; prohibiting a person, after receiving a warning not to approach from a first responder who is engaged in the lawful performance of a legal duty, from violating such warning and approaching or remaining within a specified distance of the first responder with specified intent, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Food and Hemp Products; Defining the term “total delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration”; providing conditions for the manufacture, delivery, hold, offer for sale, distribution, or sale of hemp extract; prohibiting businesses and food establishments from possessing hemp extract products that are attractive to children; prohibiting the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services from granting permission to remove or use certain hemp extract products until it determines that such hemp extract products comply with state law, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

SB 7022 (SO) by the Committee on Education Postsecondary (Grall)—

OGSR/Campus Emergency Response; Amending a provision which provides exemptions from public record and public meeting requirements for those portions of a campus emergency response which address the response of a public postsecondary educational institution to an act of terrorism or other public safety crisis or emergency; removing a provision allowing disclosure of certain information to certain entities; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

SB 7034 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Garcia)—

OGSR/Information Regarding Persons Seeking Mental Health Treatment and Services; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for petitions for voluntary and involuntary admission for mental health treatment, court orders, related records, and personal identifying information regarding persons seeking mental health treatment and services; abrogating the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

SB 7036 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Garcia)—

OGSR/Identifying Information of Persons Reporting Child Abuse, Abandonment, or Neglect; Amending a provision which provides a public records exemption for identifying information of persons reporting child abuse, abandonment, or neglect; abrogating the scheduled repeal of the exemption and the reversion of specified statutory text, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

CS/SB 1112 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Harrell—

Health Care Practitioner Titles and Designations; Providing that, for specified purposes, the use of specified titles or designations in connection with one's name constitutes the practice of medicine or the practice of osteopathic medicine; revising grounds for disciplinary action relating to a practitioner's use of such titles or designations in identifying himself or herself to patients or in advertisements for health care services; requiring certain health care practitioners to prominently display a copy of their license in a conspicuous area of their practice, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1688 (SO) by Senator Osgood and others—

Career-themed Courses; Revising the requirements for a specified school district strategic plan to include certain information; requiring the Department of Education to include specified data in an annual review of K-12 and postsecondary career and technical education offerings, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 366 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government and Senator Yarborough—

Civil Penalties Under the Gas Safety Law of 1967; Increasing, until a specified date, the civil penalty amount for violating the Gas Safety Law of 1967; increasing the maximum authorized civil penalty for any related series of violations during such timeframe; requiring the Florida Public Service Commission, after a date certain and at least annually thereafter, to establish and, if necessary, revise maximum penalties by rule based on specified factors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 580 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Yarborough and others—

Safe Exchange of Minor Children; Citing this act as the "Cassie Carli Law"; providing requirements for a parenting plan relating to the exchange of a child; requiring the court to order the parties in a parenting plan to exchange their child at a neutral safe exchange location or at a location authorized by a supervised visitation program under certain circumstances; requiring sheriffs to designate certain areas as neutral safe exchange locations; providing immunity from civil liability, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Delivery of Notices; Revising the definition of the term "registered mail" for purposes of construction of the Florida Statutes; defining the term "return receipt requested" for purposes of construction of the Florida Statutes, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Tardive Dyskinesia Awareness Week; Recognizing the week of May 5, 2024, as "Tardive Dyskinesia Awareness Week" in Florida and encouraging those experiencing uncontrollable, abnormal, and repetitive movements to consult their health care provider regarding their symptoms, etc.

SR 1802 (SR) by Senator Calatayud—

Angelman Syndrome Awareness Day; Recognizing February 15, 2024, as Angelman Syndrome Awareness Day, etc.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

SB 174 (2R) by Senator Burgess and others—

Veterans' Long Term Care Facilities Admissions; Revising eligibility for residency in the Veteran's Domiciliary Home of Florida to include specified individuals; revising the definition of "resident"; revising the admission eligibility for veterans' nursing homes to include specified individuals, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 234 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary, Senator Polisky and others—

Disclosure of Grand Jury Testimony; Revising the list of persons prohibited from disclosing the testimony of a witness examined before, or the evidence received by, a grand jury; creating an exception for a request by the media or an interested person to the prohibited publishing, broadcasting, disclosing, divulging, or communicating of any testimony of a witness examined before the grand jury, or the content, gist, or import thereof; providing criminal penalties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 258 (2R) by Senator Perry—

Interstate Safety; Defining the term "furthestmost left- hand lane"; prohibiting a driver from operating a motor vehicle in the furthestmost left-hand lane of certain roadways, except under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 260 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator DiCeglie and others—

Refusal to Submit to a Breath, Urine, or Blood Test; Requiring that a person arrested for driving or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle while under the influence who refuses to submit to a lawful test of his or her breath incident to a lawful arrest be told that he or she is subject to mandatory placement, for a specified period, of an ignition interlock device on all vehicles that are individually or jointly leased or owned and routinely operated by the person; directing the department to require placement of an ignition interlock device before issuing a permanent or restricted driver license to a person who refused to submit to a lawful test of his or her breath, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 298 (2R) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, Senator Polisky and others—

Local Government Coastal Protections; Providing that only coastal counties and coastal municipalities that received written authorization from the Department of Environmental Protection on or before a specified date may establish construction zoning and building code exceptions to coastal construction control lines; authorizing the department to provide coastal counties, beginning on a specified date, with Resilient Florida Grant Program grants to fund saltwater intrusion vulnerability assessments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 302 (2R) by Senator Boyd—

Dental Services; Requiring every dentist and certain individuals, partnerships, corporations, and other entities to provide specified information to certain patients; requiring a dentist of record to remain primarily responsible for all dental treatments for a patient treated through telehealth; requiring advertisements of dental services provided through telehealth to include a specified disclaimer for certain dental services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 312 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Senator Collins and others—

Offenses Involving Children; Increasing the maximum age of a child victim of specified acts whose out-of-court statements may be admissible in certain circumstances; providing that a first offense of specified sex trafficking offenses involving minors requires designation of the defendant as a sexual predator, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 362 (2R) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Bradley—

Medical Treatment Under the Workers' Compensation Law; Increasing limits on witness fees charged by certain witnesses; increasing maximum reimbursement allowances for physicians and surgical procedures, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 446 (2R) by Senator Simon and others—

Supported Decisionmaking Authority; Requiring a circuit court to consider certain needs and abilities of a person with a developmental disability when determining whether to appoint a guardian advocate; defining the term "supported decisionmaking agreement"; prohibiting such agreement from acting as a durable power of attorney; requiring a petition to determine incapacity of a person to include specified information relating to the alleged incapacitated person's use of assistance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 478 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Rodriguez—

Designation of Eligible Telecommunications Carriers; Revising the definition of the term “eligible telecommunications carrier”; authorizing the Public Service Commission to designate certain entities as eligible telecommunications carriers for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 534 (2R) by Senator Grall—

Equitable Distribution of Marital Assets and Liabilities; Requiring a court to consider certain factors when determining if extraordinary circumstances exist; prohibiting certain interspousal gifts unless certain requirements are met; providing that certain actions do not change whether certain real property is marital property; providing that business interest in a closely held business is a marital asset, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 554 (2R) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Bradley and others—

Hot Car Death Prevention; Citing this act as “Ariya’s Act”; designating the month of April as “Hot Car Death Prevention Month”; providing that certain agencies and local governments are encouraged to sponsor events for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 632 (2R) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, Senator Simon and others—

Taking of Bears; Citing this act as the “Self Defense Act”; providing for the taking of bears without certain penalties under specified conditions; requiring the disposal of such bears by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; prohibiting certain possession, sale, and disposal of such bears or their parts, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 648 (2R) by Senator DiCeglie—

License or Permit to Operate a Vehicle for Hire; Providing that a person who holds a license or permit issued by a county or municipality to operate a vehicle for hire may operate a vehicle for hire in any other county or municipality without being subject to certain requirements or fees under certain circumstances; providing an exception for transportation services to and from an airport; defining the term “airport”, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 660 (2R) by Senator DiCeglie—

Public Records/Animal Shelter or Animal Control Agency; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for records held by an animal shelter or animal control agency operated by a local government which contain certain information pertaining to persons with legal custody of an animal; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 682 (2R) by Senator Martin—

Lost or Abandoned Property; Revising the timeframe after which a law enforcement agency may take certain actions relating to abandoned property or specified vessels if the owner has not taken specified actions; making technical changes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules
