14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities have limited access to day time program options that provide enrichment, social activities, and personal care. There are roughly 4,000 adults with I/DD living in Marion County and only about 500 adults have access to day programs due to lack of program availability. Currently, there are four day programs available, one of which is Transitions Life Center. At TLC, programming options will be expanded to offer more varied activities for differently abled individuals. The number of spaces available for attendance will double to provide 300 spaces/week or roughly to serve 120 individuals.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The current community center houses the THRIVE (Teamwork, Honor, Respect, Independence, Values, Engineering) Program, the Community Navigator Services Program (available to any family in the community caring for an individual with I/DD connecting them to local programs and services), and administrative offices. The building expansion will allow for THRIVE to serve more individuals, expand enrichment and social activity options currently available, and include vocational training opportunities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Day program services will be provided to adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities that enrich and teach life skills, activities of daily living, enterprises (vocational training and business operations), social skills, and physical fitness. The Community Navigator Services program will provide all caregivers of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities access to advocacy efforts, connections to local programs, and assistance with applications for local services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Adults with an intellectual/developmental disability who are not eligible for traditional employment opportunities attend our day programs, 90% of whom are economically disadvantaged. While there is not a cap on age, TLC adults range from 18 years old to well into their 60s. We expect to serve 120 individuals and their families. The Community Navigator Services program serves all families, living in the local community, caring for an individual with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The emphasis of the Community Navigator program is to assist elderly caregivers caring for elderly individuals with I/DD however, its assistance is available to anyone in the community searching for services or needing assistance with completing applications.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Individuals with I/DD are currently grossly under served in Marion County. This program will allow a greater number of individuals access to day program services. With the increase in square footage, an increase in services will be put into effect. Enrollment and admissions will be tracked on a daily and monthly basis. Clients will complete a HUD approved Self-Certification form to track demographic information.
