The Council on Aging of Martin County received \$593,300 in PPP loans, which were forgiven and \$150,000 SBA Disaster Loan which must be repaid. The Council also received \$10,000 EIDL. Our medical clinic received \$63,938 in HHS Stimulus for lost revenues. We provide services throughout Martin County for seniors and this assistance was used for projects throughout the County.

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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funding would allow us to expand services offered at our existing congregate meal site in Indiantown. This project, More Than a Meal, is an extension of our Meals on Wheels program. Seniors who are able and want to socialize gather for their noontime meals. We request support to expand outreach and program offerings to senior residents. We will also expand services to cover social activities, memory enhancement, healthcare and nutrition counseling.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Expansion of our congregate meal site in Indiantown will include a case manager navigator to help seniors in crisis, a part-time nutritionist to provide nutrition counseling and education, a part-time Nurse Practitioner to identify health needs and gaps in care and improve access to healthcare services and memory enhancement services, as well as informative and fun activities will also be provided

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A variety of services will be provided to needy seniors including congregate meals, social activities, case management, nutrition counseling and education, medical services and memory enhancement services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Village of Indiantown has a senior population over 65 years of age of 18.3% or over 1,200. The Village has a higher proportion than the Florida average of minorities and has a higher poverty level at 19.7% vs. the State of Florida average of 13.1%. The Village is currently limited on both businesses, social services and healthcare. There is no major hospital in the Village and many senior residents either forgo routine healthcare or have to travel into the City of Stuart, Florida (an approximate 20+ mile distance) to access healthcare. The Village is considered economically disadvantaged and is a designated Opportunity Zone. We anticipate helping between 400-800 needy seniors.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Providing these services will delay or eliminate the need for assisted living and/or skilled nursing placement. It would reduce emergency room and hospital admissions, improve physical strength and endurance. It would also improve mental health and cognitive decline. Seniors face increased health issues stemming from poor nutrition hunger and isolation. Memory enhancement programs are proven to help delay or prevent cognitive decline.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the Council on Aging of Martin County Inc. is not meeting the deliverables or performance not outlined in the contract, then the State has the option to cancel the contract for these services.
