14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The FCRM is designed to produce a statewide museum, beginning with innovative and interactive virtual components, that will educate students and the general public on the lives/legacies of Florida's civil rights and educational pioneers, regardless of race, color, creed, or national origin. Funding will also be used to develop a statewide consortium of libraries and

community centers which will provide educational information to students, residents, tourists, and researchers worldwide.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Museum staff will conduct research and present historical contributions of various civil rights and educational pioneers. Tours, educational workshops, training sessions, and symposia will be held to educate students, researchers, scholars, tourists, residents and the general public. Educational material produced will adhere to sunshine state standards and contribute to tourism and cultural enhancement.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The establishment and maintenance of a repository of documents, publications, photographs, and artifacts, which will highlight those whose civil rights and educational contributions are significant to Florida. There will also be a database available for online research, as well as onsite use. Services will be provided through info sessions, conferences, workshops, exhibits and virtual sessions.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The majority of the funds requested will serve elderly persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, and university/college students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Educating the general public statewide about the contributions of little-known civil rights and educational pioneers who have made significant contributions to the state. Highlighting individuals across all strata, cross-culturally, without regard to race, creed or color.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Funds dispersed for deliverables unmet will be returned to the Department of State. Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
