11. Status of Construction

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If yes, indicate the amount of funds received and what the funds were used for.

Indiantown received CARES Act funding through Martin County. The total amount received was \$123,892.15. The funds were used for electronic message boards, COVID-19 signage, video conferencing software, and live streaming services. The Village did receive a total of \$3,593,124 in ARPA funds paid in two separate installments each of \$1,796,562. Of the funds spent and committed, \$919,160 was assigned to Water and Wastewater Utilities and \$743,514 to general government. The total funds that are not yet programmed is \$1,930,450, with expected allocation of \$399,500 for General Government and \$1,530,950 for drinking water improvements.

#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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This project is intended to replace a failed roadway and eliminate an unsafe drainage ditch next to the road. It will also increase vehicular safety by providing a paved roadway and update drainage to eliminate the ditch. The Village of Indiantown is less than 5 years old and is addressing infrastructure needs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The design of the drainage and roadway rehabilitation project directly impacts the Village residents in the community by reducing standing waters resulting from rainfall events, providing unbroken roadway surface, enhancing safety and emergency response times, and eliminating an unsafe drainage ditch next to the road.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Replacement of failing roadway will reduce the likelihood of vehicular accidents along the corridor, as well as reduce the response time for local emergency services traffic due to broken asphalt, ongoing pothole issue, etc. The elimination roadside ditch provides for safe roadside shoulder where none currently exist. A reduction of vehicular accidents, maintenance expenditures and emergency services response times in the community would provide a potential measure of the effectiveness of the project, as we all reduction in local complaints due to the condition of the road.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 6,000 residents in the Village of Indiantown.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Construction of these roadway improvements will result in new and repaired roadways with collection of visual data before and after photos. Safety performance number of crashes, such as crash data, road characteristics, and traffic volume. Data analysis and comparison to measure outcome.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The Village intends to utilize these funds for design and construction if the needed improvements. The Village intends to asses 5% retainage withheld, performance bond and liquidated damages for non completion within contracted time frame, as well as understanding reimbursement to the State may be required for delinquency.
