All of Sarasota County residents and visitors in addition to travelers from adjacent counties and state travelers seeking alternative routes to the interstate system.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased safety, improved multi-modal access and capacity, upgraded water and wastewater utilities, enhanced aesthetics and reduced travel times to businesses and residential areas. These benefits and outcomes will be measured by responses to Sarasota County's annual citizen survey and traffic modeling to document capacity improvements.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Sarasota County imposes daily liquidated damages for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in its vendor construction contracts. In severe cases of failure, vendors may be placed on a no-bid prohibition for County related contracting.
