14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To purchase land and build a community of foster homes based on our Hope House model. OHU proposes to provide services to male teens who are dually dependent and delinquent. These youth have struggled in many areas of their lives including running away, truancy, academically, sexually reactive behaviors, as well as other emotional and behavioral concerns. This provides a comprehensive program to these youth to give them an opportunity to succeed and increase the likelihood of future success.



b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Our service provides high quality living environments for youth who have experienced homelessness. We will have 24/7 on-site trauma-informed clinical support for youth in foster care in an environment that supports and encourages academic achievement with a study hall, computer lab, and library on site. The single family homes will deliver specialized care in a family style environment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The goal is for the youth to achieve outcomes including decrease in youth arrests and increase in school attendance and performance while reducing baker acts and run-away episodes. As an overlay to the program, OHU proposes to implement the Trauma Based Relational Intervention (TBRI) as the framework for the program. TBRI uses brain science to help heal traumatized brains.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served are high-school aged male teens, who are considered at-risk youth, economically disadvantaged, living with poor mental health, and are dually involved with DCF and DJJ. The number of youth expected to be served will be 50-100.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

- Improved mental health by decreasing Baker Acts; measured by comparing number Baker Acts prior to placement to number of Baker Acts after placement in Hope House program.

- Improved quality of education by increasing number of days youth are in school, increasing grade level, increasing GPA; measured by school attendance, grade level, and GPA before and after placement in Hope House program. - Divert from criminal/juvenile justice system by decreasing number of arrests and VOPs; measured by arrests and VOPs before and after placement in Hope House program.
