Funding also includes permanent repairs to sections of Pine Island, Stringfellow Road and Hickory Boulevard, repairs to the bridge fenders on Midpoint Bridge, News Pass Bridge, Cape Coral Bridge, and repairs to the electrical system at Matlacha Draw Bridge. Repairs include damages made to pedestrian facilities on these roadways. No work in this project will duplicate the requested appropriation for "Hurricane Ian Repairs - Matlacha Corridor".
