This Transit Center will enhance access to StarMetro service for residents living on Tallahassee's south side—including both City and County residents—and will also improve overall system performance by increasing bus frequency and ontime performance. The Transit Center will also fulfill local, state, and federal clean energy objectives.						
b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?						
There will be increased bus service to south Tallahassee.						
c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?						
Citizens in the south of the city will have access to more routes, higher frequency of buses, and increased on-time performance.						
d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?						
The target population is residents of south Tallahassee, an area of approximately 40,000 residents. This area is federa designated as an opportunity zone and home to a significant environmental justice population.						
e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?						
The expected outcomes of this construction include that more residents will access public transportation, and on-time performance will improve in this area. Passenger data and on-time performance is measured by StarMetro daily.

Future appropriations would be under greater scrutiny if the City failed to deliver on its contractual obligations.
