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Boys & Girls Clubs of the Suncoast's Tarpon Springs Teen Activity and Learning Center creates a safe location for teens, in this underserved community, to play sports, learn workforce readiness skills, and prepare to graduate from high school with a plan for their future. Being able to utilize the space efficiently by enclosing it will allow for increased programs and services for more youth and their families in the Tarpon Springs and north Pinellas County areas.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

With the assistance of BGCS youth development professionals, qualified teachers and behavioral specialists, the Tarpon Springs Teen Activity and Learning Center will provide empowerment programs that teach youth the fundamentals of self-awareness, healthy lifestyles, academic support, healthy relationships, and the soft skills necessary for employment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improved economic activities in the Tarpon Springs area will increase through employment of local residences at the Club. More youth served, means more teachers, coaches and club directors needed to guide youth in positive ways.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Boys & Girls Clubs of the Suncoast provides high quality out of school time Club experiences proven to ensure our young people, especially those that need us most, are on track to graduate from high school with a plan for the future, demonstrate good character and citizenship, and live a healthy lifestyle. The proposed project will further engage and grow the teen population and is expected to provide programming for over 100 at-risk teens annually.
