a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Repayment of funds to the state

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The goal of the initiative is to increase the number of young students who are interested in the four areas of STEM; thereby greatly increasing the overall number of STEM workers in the United States by 2035. Dream Big Academy of Learning believes that at a very early age, students gravitate towards instruction/activities that are stimulating, fun, and interactive. Students will develop critical skills & foundational knowledge in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics. Students will dive into simulations of anatomy & 3-D anatomical creations that can be produced via a 3-D printer, engineering concepts of real-world buildings, bridges, roads, & electric vehicles. Students will learn non-traditional ways to measure, calculate and design.
