### 4. Project/Program Description

The North Florida TPO (NFTPO) LRTP and Nassau County's Comprehensive Mobility Plan identify the County Road 108 Extension as a critical link to the County and Regional mobility network. Providing an east-west corridor north of and paralleling SR 200/A1A, which is part of Florida's Strategic Inter modal System (SIS), is critical for Nassau County's and Northeast Florida's transportation network over the next twenty years in response to predicted population growth in the area. The County Road 108 Ext. Will provide an alternative corridor for commuters traveling east/west through Nassau, provide an alternative evacuation route, and reduce trips on Florida's SIS. Because of the critical nature of the improvement, the corridor is identified in the NFTPO's LRTP, the County-wide Mobility Plan, the County's Future Transportation Map Series, and the East Nassau Community Planning Area Sector Plan's Mobility Plan. The seven mile roadway project has an estimated cost of approximately \$30M.

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Mobility Impact fees are currently calculated based on the improvement and construction of this extension over the next ten years. Nassau County anticipates a combination of private, local, and State funding to complete the full project.

Nassau County BOCC has received approximately \$23.9 million in CARES and ARPA funds. Nassau used the funds to provide support to small businesses, provide individual rent and foreclosure prevention assistance, acquire PPE, facilitate virtual public meetings, expand remote work capacities, and other similar eligible expenditures allowed by the US Treasury.

#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Improve local and regional mobility, improve the overall transportation network in Nassau County and Northeast Florida, provide an alternative evacuation route, improve freight/resource hauling routes to and reduce trips on a segment of Florida's Strategic Inter modal System [SR200/A1A between I95 and Amelia Island/Port of Fernandina.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Nassau County is requesting the Legislature fund the design and permitting of the project to extend CR 108 from US 17 to Chester Road. The NFTPO and Nassau County have identified this project as a critical component of the Northeast Florida Regional transportation system. Design and permitting is the first step in executing installation of the improvements. The County is currently collecting Mobility Fees to support development of the comprehensive mobility network in Nassau County.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improve local and regional mobility, improve the overall transportation network in Nassau County and Northeast Florida, provide an alternative evacuation route, and reduce trips on a segment of Florida's Strategic Inter modal System SR200/A1A between 195 and Amelia Island/Port of Fernandinal.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The more than 1.6 million residents that reside in the Jacksonville MSA, the more than 1.5 million visitors annually to Amelia Island, and those freight/resource haulers accessing the Port of Fernandina and the two paper mills on Amelia Island. By extension, the improvements serve the greater interests of the State by promoting industrial commerce, facilitating the State's tourism economy, reducing trips on the Strategic Inter modal System, and creating a new evacuation route.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve local and regional mobility, improve the overall transportation network in Nassau County and Northeast Florida, provide an alternative evacuation route, and reduce trips on a segment of Florida's Strategic Inter modal System [SR200/A1A between 195 and Amelia Island/Port of Fernandina].
