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The Community Scholars program works with local students beginning in the ninth grade to provide community service-learning opportunities in fulfillment of service hours required by the State of Florida for Bright Futures scholarships. The project will place students in a service-learning laboratory that will nurture learning and connect participants with community needs. The students have access to diverse opportunities and projects to support local non-profit and social service groups.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Community Scholars Program will include workshops in Community Health, Peer Support and Mentorship, Environmental Science, Food Insecurity and Feeding Programs, Cultural Competency and Acculturation, Civil Rights, and Civic Responsibilities. Scholars will also attend and participate in university visits and programming.
