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### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Immokalee is in desperate need of a new fire station to securely house our firefighters and serve the needs of its citizens and visitors. The current facility is 44 plus years old. It doesn't have a hurricane rating and is simply beyond repair. Issues such as flooding/seepage from rain, roof leaks, and constant mold are just some of the daily struggles plaguing this fire station.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities provided include fire and life safety, education, prevention and training activities through Open Houses, course offerings and formal training. In addition, community meetings will be conducted monthly so the community can gain awareness related to the Immokalee Fire Control District's (District) operations and activities, as well as and learn how the District manages the use of taxpayer funding.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The services provided directly correspond with the activities noted above, in that each service extended will directly correspond to the individual's need. The Immokalee Fire Control District (District) is recognized as a Rural Area of Opportunity and a Rural Area of Economic Concern (Section 288.0656, Florida Statutes) with over 70% of our residents in the "low to moderate income status" based on the 2011-2015 HUD Census Data.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Immokalee is an unincorporated community and census-designated place in Collier County, Florida. Per the 2020 statistics, this station is in Immokalee proper thereby serving a population of 24,557. Demographics include 72.7% Hispanic or Latino, 49.6% White Alone and 24.7% is two or more races, leaving 21.1% Black or African American.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits are improvement in physical health; improvement in mental health; improvement in quality of education; protection of the general public from harm (environmental, criminal, etc.); and reduction of carcinogen exposure of all employees.

The new fire station will be constructed to all meet current standards and recommendations by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). There is an NFPA standard for all the expected benefits of this project.
