MC received \$31,272,363 from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) which is currently being utilized to provide grants to community partners and fund capital infrastructure for clean water.

A well trained emergency response staff able to increase response times and improved level of response to public emergencies by fire rescue staff.

The entire County population will see increased response times and improved level of response to public emergencies by fire rescue staff.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

Increase response times and improved level of response to public emergencies by fire rescue staff. Increased county revenue by 1) offering Training Tower facility rental/usage by outside agencies and 2) cost and resource savings gained by not sending staff outside of Martin County for required training. Increase fire rescue staff capacity by providing an in-house training tower. Properly trained staff will reduce risk of injury while performing job functions. Monitor fire rescue response times, staff turnover rates, job satisfaction ratings, hours and level of staff training, staff promotions and Monitor fire rescue staff training hours. Monitor on the job injury rates and days missed due to injury.
