The Town of Surfside is seeking \$200,000 in funding for the Inclusive Mobility and Accessibility Enhancement Project. This project is aimed at improving mobility and safety within Surfside by creating accessible pathways to key destinations, including the park, Town Hall, post office, community center, and grocery store. It encompasses roundabouts, signage upgrades, and crosswalk improvements for ADA compliance on residential roads, benefiting pedestrians, wheelchair users, visually impaired individuals, cyclists, and those seeking safer routes. By engaging a consultant for design and a contractor for implementation, the town will carry out the project within its limits, directly supporting the community. The impact extends beyond physical mobility, encompassing improved public health, mental well-being, and community safety, as evaluated through surveys and community feedback. Construction is scheduled from October 2024 to June 2025, with community support and documented need.
