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To foster collaboration, data collection, education and oversight of Florida's 211 Network; support coordination between FLAIRS/211s and state and local governments to provide the data that identifies gaps and trends in community health delivery and effectively target state and local resources during emergencies and natural disasters.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Deliver real-time information aggregated at the community level to state agencies on the impact of emergencies or natural disasters on citizens across the state; identify gaps in human services to effectively target state and local resources to address emerging community trends/needs; educate providers on state and federal standards and measure 211 service delivery against statutory requirements.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

State funding will be used to improve 211 service delivery to meet state and community objectives to respond effectively to citizen needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All citizens across the state who need access to accurate and timely information.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve targeting of state and local resources to address emerging community trends and needs, support community disaster recovery efforts in communities across the state; educate providers on state and federal standards and measure 211 service delivery against statutory requirements to improve, for example, the implementation of the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline, Veterans support services, accessibility of 211 Network services to the visually or hearing impaired, seniors and residents in underserved communities, and more.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Funds for deliverables not met would be returned to the State.
