Improve the right of way adjacent to a public elementary school to provide safer and more convenient travel to and from the school.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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All improvements are within and directly to the public right of way adjacent to a public elementary school. The funds will be used toward reconstructing the sidewalk, curb, and grassed area to better serve the public, especially children walking or biking to school.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Replace valley curb with F-curb to help protect pedestrians. Add on-street parking to provide an alternative to parents driving on to the grass adjacent to the sidewalk. Replace the existing 4' sidewalk with 10' to enhance pedestrian, bicycle, and ADA accessibility.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elementary school children and their guardians, the general public using the corridor; Approximately 800.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The existing right of way has no hardscape protection for pedestrians. The improvements will add protective F-curb and the on-street parking will discourage parents from driving on the grass near the sidewalk. Success will be measured by consulting with the school about incident reports and usage rates of the improved corridor.
