#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

OSC is proposing an analysis of statewide science and math scores to identify where the largest gaps exist and the standards that students struggle with the most to address significant drops in Florida State testing pass rates in these subjects. OSC will develop and deliver training modules for parents, teachers & students to help improve science and math scores, allowing Florida's youth the opportunity to be more competitive in these subjects and to provide access to lucrative careers.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

After analyzing statewide science and math scores and identifying hardest to understand standards, OSC will provide training modules that raise students' understanding, give teachers alternate strategies for teaching these concepts, and provide parents with support to serve as their child's first teacher. Curriculum will include engaging hands on activities & take home materials for learning at home.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

OSC will directly serve parents, teachers, and students. We will deliver training and make training modules available to homeschool families struggling with science. We will deliver training to teachers, raising their understanding of and focus on hard to understand science standards. We will deliver training to students with engaging hands on activities to bring difficult concepts to life.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Grade school students, high school students, parents, teachers, and caregivers. 800+ individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is to improve quality of education. We will specifically measure increased student confidence and interest in science and math concepts, as well as increased understanding and focus from parents and teachers on "hard-to-understand" science and math concepts to raise statewide math and science test scores that will ultimately make Florida students more competitive in science and math and the lucrative careers that require these skills. OSC will evaluate statewide scores to identify improvements for the standards that were targeted through our training.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

OSC will furnish reports to describe the project progress during the period of performance. Any unused funds will be returned to the State of Florida.
