**4. Project/Program Description**

Develop a technological solution that accelerates and assists law enforcement operations through digital forensics (DF) in today's time constrained operating environments. The goal is to introduce a State Guard Digital Forensic Centers of Excellence that assists, advises, and inter-operates with law enforcement in DF operations to include the extraction, normalization, and analysis of smart phones, feature phones, computers, tablets, SIM cards, USB media, memory cards, and hard drives. The digital forensic load experienced by large and small police department field operators will be decreased through the development of a unified solution that allows law enforcement to interface with legally acquired data ensuring that all citizens rights are protected and that criminals are prosecuted quickly, accurately, and safely. This advancement in the modernization of how Florida protects its citizens will be key for policymakers to continue to gain the trust of its people.

#### 14. Program Performance

**a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?**

Innovations in technology are designed for "good," but the reality is that criminals discovered long ago that digital technology is the key to exploiting new areas of opportunity. Crimes involving drug and human trafficking, organized crime syndicates, and domestic and international terrorism are all on the rise. Cellebrite is the leader in digital forensics and will help defeat these crimes.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

Criminal cases now include digital evidence as part of the investigation. Florida is currently the third state ranked nationally as the worst in human trafficking. While technology is seen as the answer to the growing digital challenges, devices are becoming more sophisticated and the number of sources that must be examined to find actionable digital evidence continues to increase and is causing a burden on law enforcement. The State and/or National Guard equipped with Cellebrite capabilities and Exodus Road training can help relieve this burden on investigative timelines of law enforcement investigators and assist significantly with fight against human trafficking.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

Crime is on the rise, so the number of cases law enforcement is investigating is growing. Cases today are also far more complex. At the same time, law enforcement staff numbers are decreasing as budget cuts and retirements take their toll. Criminals are also becoming far more tech savvy, leaving many agencies to play catch-up as they try to retrain existing officers or recruit new ones with stronger technical skills. Public scrutiny has also made the average officer's job more challenging, and others are simply leaving the police force for jobs in the private sector which leaves agencies to wrestle with doing more with less. The State Guard and National Guard equipped and trained in digital forensic will help protect citizens by accelerating investigations.

Statewide.

Cellebrite and Exodus Road together cultivating a partnership with the State Guard and/or Florida National Guard to support law enforcement by utilizing digital forensics as a tool to fight human trafficking.
