4. Project/Program Description

The Parrish Fire District (PFD) is requesting two million dollars in funding from the Florida Legislature to construct PFD station #2 and a secondary fire station that would provide more efficient fire rescue and medical services and maximize response time. The stations would lower insurance premiums for homeowners within PFD due to the residents proximity to the stations and other fire suppression equipment. Moreover, the project also includes a training tower that maximizes the credits for improved ISO score. Additionally, this funding would allow PFD to provide immediate aid rather than delayed or non-efficient mutual aid response to bordering fire districts. Lastly, this funding would accelerate the purchase of a new ladder truck to assist in emergency response.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Local construction funding of Parrish Fire District Station #2 driven by growth & National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1710 standards, which will: 1) Reduce insurance premiums for residents and businesses. 2) Provide more efficient Fire Rescue/Medical Services; 3) Place a fire station within five-mile response area, maximizing response times and lowering insurance premiums for homeowners; 3) Provide automatic aid rather than delayed or non-efficient mutual aid response to bordering Fire Districts; 4) Accelerate purchase of ladder truck

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Quicker response times for fire protection, rapid rescue and medical response to the community. Also, the Parrish Fire District will be able to provide more non-emergency functions such as fire prevention to schools & citizens, pre-fire service inspections, CPR and AED training, and accelerate the planned purchase of a ladder truck.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Emergency types of responses to fires, hazardous materials, high angle & confined space rescues and all types of medical emergencies for this fast growing community. Additionally, Parrish Fire District will also provide fire prevention education to schools citizens, pre-fire service inspections and CPR/AED training, and other first aid training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All residents and visitors to the area will be serviced along with residents/visitors where we provide mutual aid.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve quality of education through Fire Prevention education for the youth and adults in Parrish through increased events within the community. Protect the general public from harm. Station #2 will assist in providing faster response times thus reducing the exposure of the general public from harm. Following NFPA 1710 Standards and NIST Technical Note 1661 Report on Residential Fireground Experiments will ensure we are maximizing and achieving industry standards for protection of people/property and emergency response care for people.
