Hundreds of jobs are generated, both direct and indirectly by the film industry as well as the overall benefit of promoting Miami-Dade County and boosting economic development.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funds will target the general population involved in the creative filmmaking industry. Approximately 800 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

These funds can attract 1-2 TV /Streaming series that employ 100's of residents and infuses money into dozens of local businesses. These projects spend anywhere from \$10 to \$25 million into the local economy over a 6-8 month time frame. Miami-Dade County requires a Return on Investment to be at least \$10 to \$1 for their local program. The ROI is measured on every dollar spent locally in relation to the amount of inducement received.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
