Nicklaus is the only freestanding children's hospital in the S. Florida region & Medicaid represents 65% of our patients seeking specialty pediatric care. During COVID, Nicklaus experienced continued operating losses of \$2-3 million per month & had over \$100 million impact in decreased patient revenue. Nicklaus received \$60 million in federal assistance.

There is extensive research demonstrating correlation with simulation training for healthcare professionals and patient safety and benefits of simulation training for clinical settings and effectiveness in team performance.

Nicklaus Children's Hospital is South Florida's only licensed specialty hospital exclusively for children. Neonates and babies, preschool students, grade school students and high school students given the healthcare professionals treating these populations will be trained with simulation.
